
PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD U. S.

INSTRUCTIONS: .

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O = Corner monument restored.

> East Meander Corner #2 common to Sections 6 and 7, T.34N., R.14E., Forest County, Wisconsin



(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859, J. McBride over lake and set meander post and made the following B.T.'s: Tamarack, 12", N.79°E., Il links (7.26 feet); Tamarack, 16", S.10°E., 12 links (7.92 feet).

In 1946, H. Crawford, G.L.O. Surveyor, found cedar post and original tamarack stumps. Set a G.L.O. monument and made the following B.T.'s: W. Birch, 9", N.60°E., 81 links (53.46 feet); W. Birch, 10", S.48°45'E., 49 1/2 links (32.67 feet).


In 1964, J. Resvick, R.L.S., found corner as per Crawford and set a $4" \times 4"$ wood sign post by monument.

In 1990, A. Harrison found corner as per Crawford and Resvick. W. Birch B.T. southeast dead and down. Made new references.

 3. R. Maple, 9", S.38°W., 18.18 feet.
 4. R. Maple, 6", North, 23.11 feet.

 - 5. Wood sign post, South, 0.86 feet.
