

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859 James McBride set a wood post and made the following bearing trees; Elm, 14" N.18°W., 18 links (11.88 feet), Sugar, 12", S.70°e., 19 links, (12.54 feet).


In 1934 John Laird, a Forest Service Examiner found a wood stake which bears North 2 feet from a metal location poster on the North side of a 2" diameter Maple sapling. Corner is buried in road which bears West and North. This info is recorded on Form # 874.

In 1987 Paul Smith, R.L.S., surveyed section 28 and restored the corner using Nathan Smiths R.L.S., 1905 and 1910 records. He set an aluminum Forest County Monument and new bearing trees.

On October 5, 1993, Alan Harrison, R.L.S., found the Forest County Monument as set by Paul Smith in 1987. This position does not line up with the road center-lines West and North.

On November 18, 1993, Alan Harrison, R.L.S., and Paul Smith R.L.S., located a metal location poster inside a 16" diameter maple tree. Road center-lines bear West and North. This evidence is in agreement with the info as noted on Form #874 dated in 1934. It is agreed between Alan Harrison and Paul Smith that this is the best available evidence for restoring the corner. At a point 2 feet North of location Poster set a 2 1/2" x 36" aluminum monument and new bearing trees as noted below.

- (c) in the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, iron orother equally durable material.)

 - 6. Basswood, 7", S.40°W., 26.38 feet.
 - 7. Steel Sign Post, Northwest, 1.10 feet.
