

## U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD.


This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) Identity the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system.

O - Comer monument restored.

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1959, J. McBride set a wood post for the corner and the following corner references:

24 1ks. 12" S53°E Sugar Maple 18" 30 1ks. N14°E Sugar Maple

In 1988, Found no evidence in the area which has been heavily logged. Placed a 2 1/2' X 36" aluminum monument.
