

This corner can also be described as:	THE QUARTER SECTION CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 24,
	T35N-R13E, AND 19, T35N-R14E, 4TH P.M.
This corner was established during the	original survey of this township, as noted

in the Original Field Notes for the Original Survey of T35N-R13E, 4th p.m.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the location of this corner.

At the point determined for the location of the corner I emplaced a:

"GALVANIZED IRON PIPE, THREE FEET LONG, ONE INCH IN DIAMETER, WITH ALUMINUM CAP DENOTED AS, 'KIMBERLY-CLARK CORP T35N 1/4 BTWN 24 & 19 R13-14E SPERHAKE RLS 463 10-11-62".

The pipe is witnessed by:

Basswood 3 S43W $25\frac{1}{2}$ links. (Scribed S24 NBT). Maple 3 S24E 22 links. (Scribed S19 NBT).

Description as to how corner was located:


At first there appeared to be no evidence of the original corner present. Thus, I prepared to set it by proportionate measurement between the previously established section corners one half mile north and south, respectively. Distance between the corners is 79.93 chains. Therefore, I planned to set the 1/4 cr. 39.96½ chains from either section corner, on a straight line between them. At the exact chainage, but 3 links west of a straight line between the two section corners was located a hole about 3 inches in diameter, about 2 feet deep, and containing a shaft of charred wood. Its position, size, and the imprebability of its just being coincidentally placed convinces me that it is the site of the original corner. I emplaced the pipe at this spot.

In 1962 Neal Sperhake, RLS, found evidence of this corner in the form of a post rotted in a small vertical hole. He set a 1" iron pipe with aluminum cap stamped for corner.

I located Sperhake's monument in good condition but lacking bearing trees.

I accepted his monumented and brought it up to USFS standards.

Corner consists of a 1" iron pipe with aluminum cap stamped for corner. Ties are to aluminum nails driven into the tree centers which trees were blazed and scribed. Bearings are magnetic.
