
## INSTRUCTIONS


This record shall show the location of the corner and thall include all of the following nine elements (a through ).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system.

O = Corner monument restored.

Quarter corner to Sections 36 and 31, T.35N., R15 & 16E., Forest County, Wisconsin.






(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1857, Artemas Curtis, set wood post with the following Bts: Yellow Birch, 11", N47W., 27 links; Hemlock, 14", S24E., 28 links.

In 1988, Al Harrison, found a 5"x 5" squared top of a cedar post 18" long. Found post hole with wood fragments vertical in hole. No original B.T. remains were recovered. Accepted post hole as the best available evidence of corner location.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (Witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, iron or other equally durable material.)

  Describe witness monuments.
