

In 1927, Goodman Lumber Company found an Elm post believed set by Wells Company surveyors. They set a 3" Maple post and a 2" flue pipe 20" high.


In 1934-35, J. J. Jenkins, Menominee County Surveyor, while surveying the east boundary of T.35N., R.16E., set a 4" iron pipe with brass cap stamped to identify the corner.

In 1969, J. Resvick (RLS) found Jenkins' County monument. He mounded rock around monument and added the following BTs: Maple, 7", S.56°E., 21.12 feet; Maple, 10", S.32°W., 10.83 feet; Maple, 15", N.49°W., 35.32 feet.

In 1987, A. Harrison (RLS) found monument and accessories as per Resvick. He repainted the BTs and added a steel sign post which bears south, 1.33 feet from corner.


