




## U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS: /

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O . Corner monument restored.

> Quarter corner to Sections 26-27, T.35N., R.16E., Forest County, Wisconsin.




Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set a wood post with the following B.T.'s: Hemlock, 30", S.74°W., 18 links (11.88 feet); Birch, 18", S.53°E., 17 links (11.22 feet).

In 1990, Alan D. Harrison (RLS) searched and found no evidence of corner or B.T.'s.. Corner restored by single proportionate measures.

  - 5. Steel Sign Post, 6', South, 1.54 feet.
