

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set quarter post and made the following B.T.'s: Linen, 14", N.63°E., 18 links (11.85 feet); Hemlock, 10", S.16°W., 3 links (1.98 feet).


In 1936, a C.C.C. suvey of Truck Trail #353 along the old grade found quarter post 11 feet East of station 170 + 43.

In 1984, Harrison and Neider found 2" iron pipe on hillside 60feet West of F.R. 2134 (T.T. 353). Pipe was set by F.S. employee in early 1960's 40 chains South of iron pipe approximate center quarter corner.

In 1989, Harrison reconstructed road survey from bridge North to curve South of search area. Found a 1" iron bolt, 2' long buried under East side of road. At record original distance is basswood progeny. Centerline of old railroad grade 11 feet West.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (Witness monuments the Bhall be made of concrete, natural atone, iron or other equally durable material.)

 - 1. 1" diameter bolt 6" below road surface.
 - 2. 2½" x 36" aluminum witness monument stamped to identify corner location, East, 15.23 feet.
 - 3. Aspen, 10", S.71°W., 40.23 feet.
 - 4. Sugar, 5", N.46°W., 52.29 feet.
 - 5. Steel sign post, East. 16.18 feet.



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(e) Describe any material discrepancy between the location of the corner as restored or reastabilished and the location of that corner as previously restored or reestablished by distance and direction. Show the discrepancy on the plan view drawing under (d), shows. Show the distances between the corner as previously restored or reestablished and (1) the corner as restored or reestablished, and (2) to at least 2 of the vitness monuments shown on the drawing in (d), above.
