


In 1857, Artemis Curtis set quarter post and made the following B.T.'s: Y. Birch, 12", N.80°W., 17 links (11.22 feet); W. Pine, 16", S.50°E., 24 links (15.84 feet).

In 1980, H. Neider found 4" Marinette County monument 4 feet into beaver flowage.

In 1989, Al Harrison found corner as per Gould and Neider. Beaver flowage dry. From monument at S.50°E., 15.84 feet is a 16"-18" W. Pine stump with B.T. blaze overgrowth.
