



In 1986 I found corner marked by a 2" iron pipe with cap; found very old 3 " sq. cedar stake leaned against a tree nearby; found remains of original B.T.s as follows; Hemlock Stp. Hole 3' N.70 W. 5.5', Hemlock Stp. Hole 2' N.45 E. 15.4', Rotted Cedar Stp. 18" S.20 E. 26.5'; I accept this position as correct; referenced by driving 60d spikes in existing B.T. s as shown below.
