


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859 James Mc Bride set a wood post and marked B.T.s as follows; Hemlock 24" N.27 E. 29 lks., Hemlock 14" S.08 W. 30 lks.

In 1986 I found corner marked by an old 2" iron pipe in ancient, fallen, fence corner, old fences run north, east and west; E.- W. fence has been rebuilt 7' south of corner; replaced iron pipe with 2"x 36" aluminum pipe with cap; referenced as shown below.
