





In 1934-35, J. J. Jenkins, Menominee County Surveyor, while surveying for Marinette County, set a 4" iron post for the corner. In 1936-37, F. Gould and B. Hammes, Deputy County Surveyors, said they found old post at corner and stumps checked for BTs. In 1969, J. Resvick (RLS) found a 4" iron post with a brass cap stamped for corner. He added the following BTs: Maple, 10", N.22°E., 35.45 feet; Maple, 13", S.46°E., 32.07 feet; Maple, 6", S.68°W., 11.34 feet; Elm, 7", N.13°W., 31.43 feet. In 1984, M. Stefan (RLS) found monument and accessories as per Resvick. Repainted BTs and added a steel sign post which bears north, 1.2 feet from corner. In 1988, A. Harrison found monument and accessories as per Stefan, found the Elm BT to be dead and replaced it with a Basswood, 8", N.41°W., 26.23 feet from monument.
