Corner recovered by J.J. Melendy, in 1918. Recovered old post and original W.Pine BT. Tamarack was gone. Set new corner post and marked NBTs - Birch 9" S 71° W 22 lks and Birch 10" S 81° E 38 lks.

Corner recovered by V.M. Maine, County Surveyor, Oneida County. Recovered post, stump of original W.Pine BT and Melendy's BTs. Set new iron pipe with brass cap.

Corner recovered Maine's iron pipe and Melendy's post. Upon digging found point of original stake. Set new post, checked to Melendy's BTs.

Description of corner evidence found:

Recovered Melendy's old post laying down, Lawrence's squared and scribed 4" cedar post scribed 1/4S S13 RILE, 1/4S S18 RILE, also laying down.

Recovered Maine's iron pipe with brass cap standing in good condition, although not set in

ground very deep. Cap stamped T37N Rll Sec.13/S18 1/4.

Recovered OBT - W.Pine 12" N 16° W 43 lks.

Recovered Melendy's BT - Birch 10" (12") S 81° E 38 lks, scribed 1/4S S18.

Birch 9" S 71° W 22 lks, down and decayed.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

As iron pipe was not set very deep, it was extracted from ground and reset to project 24" above ground. Restamped brass cap.

NBT - Cedar 6" N 46° E 48.6 lks, scribed 1/4 BT.
