Tamarack 14" N25°E 13 1ks.

West 1.24 chains, creek 15 1ks wide runs South.

Description of corner evidence found:

In 1989, John Schulke found deflection of State Highway 32 in the general area of the corner. Stream crosses roadway to the West of the deflection. I accepted the alignment of the State Highway 32 and the stream as the best available evidence to position the corner.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

Set a 2 1/2" dia. X 60" aluminum magnetic cap witness monument stamped to identify the the location of the corner. Set a railroad spike at the corner. Set a steel sign post 0.8 ft. North of the witness monument. The stream bears West a distance of 82 feet from the railroad spike. The following corner references:


