

In 1971, Jean Resvick, a Land Surveyor with the U.S. Forest Service, restored corner position at midpoint and on line between the SE corner and the SW corner of Section 5. He set a 2" diameter galvanized iron pipe with a brass cap stamped as follows: T37N, R13E, 1/4, S5, S8, 1971, S-802 from which the following bear:

West, 40.25 chains, set wood post, Cedar, 12", S 55°W, 12 1ks, Hemlock, 10", N, 20°E, 30 1ks


Black Spruce 5" N 61°E 8.6 feet Black Spruce 5" S 02°W 15.9 feet

A survey by Jean Resvick dated 1965 - 1971 which included Sections, 4,5,6,7 is on file with the U.S.F.S.
