
## PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD U.

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O - Corner monument restored.

Quarter corner to Sections 7 and 8, T:37N., R.15E., Forest County, Wisconsin.



Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, accupational evidence, testimonial evidency other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1865, J. L. Nowlin set a wood post with the following B.T.'s: White Pine, 40", S.32°E., 30 links (19.80 feet); Hemlock, 10", N.17°W., 10 links (6.60 feet).

In 1935, W. A. Goulet (CCC) found a Black Spruce post. A metal location poster on a dead Hemlock, 7", Northwest, 2 links (1.32 feet).

In 1990, Alan D. Harrison (RLS) found a Pine stump 40" with B.T. blaze on the Northwest side, no scribing visible because of fire damage. Accepted stump as original B.T. and set corner position at N.32°W., 19.80 feet from stump.

  - 1.  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36" aluminum monument with tablet stamped to identify the corner.


