

In 1972, Jean Resvick recovered a wooden post with scribing, lying on the ground. Also recovered the following 1857 bearing trees: Basswood clump bears N29°W, 20 lks.

Sugar stump bears S48°E, 35 lks.

Set a 2" dia. galvanized wrought iron pipe, filled with concrete, with a brass cap marked to identify the corner. The following corner references:

Sugar 6" bears N15°E, 19.55 ft. Hemlock 15" bears S67°W, 35.80 ft.

In 1990, John Schulke recovered monument in place and the following corner references: Sugar Maple 10" bears NO8°E, 35.83 ft. Hemlock 16" bears S77°W, 19.20 ft. Dead Hemlock 16" bears S74°E, 8.97 ft. Steel Post bears East, 1.3 ft. The following new bearing tree: Sugar Maple 6" bears S64°E, 22.58 ft.


