




U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through ().

Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O - Corner monument restored.

Quarter Corner Common to Sections 2 and 3, Township 37 North, Range 16 East, Forést County, State of Wisconsin.

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859, James McBride set a wooden post at the corner and with the following bearing trees: Sugar 10" S84°E, 26 lks. Sugar 12" S86°W, 42 lks.

In 1982, Kim Pritzlaff established the corner and set 2" dia. driveable aluminum Berntsen monument stamped to identify the corner. The following corner references:

811 Maple S22°E 17.48 ft. 6" Maple N61°E 5.88 ft. Steel post S30°E 1.2 ft.

In 1990, John Schulke recovered monument in place and flush to the ground. Also, recovered the following corner references: 7" Red Maple N76°E 5.87 ft. Red Maple 9" S15°E 17.47 ft.

Steel sign post SE The following new corner reference: Red Maple 5" N69°W 48.62 ft.

Center line of a two track is West 30 ft. of the monument.
