
U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O - Corner monument restored.

Quarter Corner Common to Sections 5 and 32, Township 37 and 38 North, Range 16 East, Forest County, State of Wisconsin.



- (b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.
 - In 1857, Artemas Curtis set a wooden post at the corner and selected the following bearing trees: Tamarack 10" bears N10°E, 15 1ks. Tamarack 8" S27°W, 20 1ks.
 - In 1974, Jean Resvick recovered a wooden post at the corner and the following bearing trees: Dead Tamarack 12" bears N10°E, 11.0 ft. Dead Tamarack bears S27°W, 20 1ks. 8" bears S85°W, 18.97 ft. Cedar Replaced the wooden post with 2" dia. galvanized iron pipe, filled with concrete, with a brass cap stamped to identify the corner. The following corner references: Balsam 4" bears N39°E, 13.23 ft. Balsam 3" bears S23°E, 14.57 ft. 8" bears S85°E, 18.97 ft. Steel sign post bears East, 0.5 ft. Cedar
 - In 1982, Kim Pritzlaff recovered monument in place and the 1974 corner references described on the Certified Land Corner Restoration form filed in the Forest County Register of Deed's Office, Document #105816.
 - In 1990, John Schulke recovered monument in place and the following corner references: Cedar 12" bears N88°W, 18.98 ft. Balsam 8" bears N38°E, 13.77 ft. 6" bears S27°E, 14.76 ft. Steel sign post bears East 0.6 ft. Balsam The following new corner references: Cedar 6" bears N16°E, 37.12 ft.
