



SURVEY NOTES

This survey was made by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, for the purpose of locating and marking the boundaries of U. S. Government land on the perimeter of Section 26, Township 35 North, Range 1^{14} East, Fourth Principal Meridian, Forest County, Wisconsin.

The U. S. Government lands in this section were acquired in 1936 and 1938.

The original Government subdivision survey of this township was made in 1859.

The corner positions recovered by this survey were monumented by Jean Resvick (R.L.S.), Cadastral Surveyor for the Forest Service, while surveying Section 25, T.35N., R.14E. in 1976 and recovered in their true positions. Said corners are marked by the monument described in the map legend.
