Dear Mr. Lusty,

The purpose of this letter is to have a written complaint on file, in addition to the verbal one made in 1993.

In approximately June 1988 a family purchased a portion of a farm adjoining our property. The survey work was done by Mr. Kelley of Elcho.

Kelly's survey moved a property line that had existed since May 1919, perhaps since 1899 and possibly even 1882. Kelly's new line deviates from the previously established property line between the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31 in the town of Neva.

I believe that this newly established property line is wrong, illegal, and that it should be corrected. Anything that can be done to clarify this situation will be greatly appreciated.

Dear Mr. Sargent:


This letter is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 28, 1995, regarding the line between the SW quarter and the NW quarter of Section 31, Town of Neva.
