

Population decreased by 176 over the last 5 years and is projected to decrease by 159 over the next 5 years.


Median household income is \$13.9K below the national median household income of \$55.3K.

As of 2017 the region's population **declined by 1.9%** since 2012, falling by 176. Population is expected to **decrease by 1.8%** between 2017 and 2022, losing 159.

From 2012 to 2017, jobs declined by 0.1% in Forest County, WI from 3,620 to 3,616. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 7.6% by 7.7%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate increased from 52.9% to 53.8% between 2012 and 2017.

Concerning educational attainment, **8.9% of Forest**County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree
(9.5% below the national average), and **11.5% hold an**Associate's Degree (3.6% above the national average).

The top three industries in 2017 are Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Logging.







Labor Force Participation Rate Trends






Unemployment Rate Trends




Millennials

Forest County, WI has 1,414 millennials (ages 20-34). The national average for an area this size is 1,881.




Forest County, WI has 857 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 531.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Forest County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 1,381 people 65 or older, while there are 2,049 here.




Violent Crime

Property Crime


Forest County, WI has 11.94 property crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 24.22 per 1,000 people.








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry LQ




