- As of 2019 the region's population **declined by 1.8%** since 2014, falling by 163. Population is expected to **decrease by 1.4%** between 2019 and 2024, losing 127.
- From 2014 to 2019, jobs increased by 0.7% in Forest County, WI from 3,596 to 3,622. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 6.9% by 6.2%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 53.3% to 55.0% between 2014 and 2019.
- Concerning educational attainment, **8.0% of Forest County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (10.8% below the national average), and **10.3% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.3% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2019 are Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.





Forest County, WI had a July 2019 unemployment rate of 4.98%, **decreasing from 8.66%** 5 years before.




Millennials

Forest County, WI has 1,327 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 1,849.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Forest County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 2,603 people 55 or older, while there are 3,579 here.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Forest County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 3,562 racially diverse people, while there are 1,913 here.




Veterans










