- The top three industries in 2021 are General Freight Trucking, Outpatient Care Centers, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

Sep 2022 Labor Force Breakdown




Educational Attainment










Job Trends




Wood County, WI had a September 2022 unemployment rate of 3.44%, decreasing from 3.70% 5 years before.







Wood County, WI has 5,122 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 3.928.


















Top Industry Location Quotient










