

Median household income is \$11.0K below the national median household income of \$69.0K.


Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 2.4% since 2017, growing by 1,731. Population is expected to increase by 3.5% between 2022 and 2027, adding 2,619.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 3.7% in Wood County, WI from 41,147 to 39,638. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 2.4% by 6.1%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 60.2% to 54.0% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **13.4% of Wood County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (7.4% below the national average), and **13.5% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.7% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are General Freight Trucking, Outpatient Care Centers, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends






Wood County, WI had a December 2022 unemployment rate of 2.67%, decreasing from 3.70% 5 years before.




Millennials

Wood County, WI has 12,600 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 15,130.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 22,016 people 55 or older, while there are 27,307 here.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 30,142 racially diverse people, while there are 6,278 here.




Wood County, WI has 5,353 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 3.890.

Wood County, WI has 1.05 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.59 per 1,000 people.




Property Crime






Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Location Quotient






Top Industry GRP






Top Growing Occupations






Top Occupation Location Quotient





Unique Average Monthly Postings




