Regional average earnings per job are \$22.9K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.


Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 7.2% since 2017, growing by 14,021. Population is expected to increase by 8.4% between 2022 and 2027, adding 17,522.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 2.0% in Grow North from 84,720 to 83,004. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.8% by 5.8%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 61.6% to 54.9% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.3% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.5% below the national average), and **12.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (3.8% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity














Millennials


Retiring Soon


















Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP








Top Occupation Employment Concentration


Top Occupation Earnings







Educational Pipeline

In 2021, there were 502 graduates in Grow North. This pipeline has shrunk by 13% over the last 5 years.
