

Median household income is \$17.1K below the national median household income of \$69.0K.


Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 5.0% since 2018, growing by 1,015. Population is expected to increase by 2.6% between 2023 and 2028, adding 553.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs declined by 5.7% in Adams County, WI from 5,885 to 5,551. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 9.6%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 47.8% to 42.5% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **11.8% of Adams County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (9.3% below the national average), and **8.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.3% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Crop Production, Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Traveler Accommodation.








Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity












Adams County, WI had a February 2024 unemployment rate of 6.80%, increasing from 4.85% 5 years before.



Millennials




Veterans

Adams County, WI has 1,740 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 1,110.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Adams County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 6,361 people 55 or older, while there are 10,838 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in Adams County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 8,729 racially diverse people, while there are 2,267 here.




Property Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP




Top Occupation Employment Concentration




