


#### **Takeaways**

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 2.5% since 2018, growing by 1,850. Population is expected to increase by 3.3% between 2023 and 2028, adding 2,444.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs declined by 4.0% in Wood County, WI from 42,427 to 40,747. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 7.9%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 60.1% to 55.1% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.5% of Wood County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.6% below the national average), and **14.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (5.6% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are General Freight Trucking, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.






### **Unemployment by Gender**







### **Job Trends**






Wood County, WI had a February 2024 unemployment rate of 4.21%, increasing from 3.64% 5 years before.







#### **Millennials**




Wood County, WI has 5,353 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 3,870.




#### **Retiring Soon**

Retirement risk is high in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 22,174 people 55 or older, while there are 27,603 here.




#### **Violent Crime**

Racial diversity is low in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 30,429 racially diverse people, while there are 6,242 here.




#### **Property Crime**








### **Top Industry Employment Concentration**









### **Top Occupation Employment Concentration**



### **Educational Pipeline**

In 2022, there were 882 graduates in Wood County, WI. This pipeline has grown by 6% over the last 4 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide" (Certificate), "Emergency Medical Technology/Technician (EMT Paramedic)" (Certificate), and "Registered Nursing/Registered Nurse" (Associate's).
