
Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 2.3% since 2018, growing by 1,671. Population is expected to increase by 1.8% between 2023 and 2028, adding 1,348.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs declined by 4.0% in Wood County, WI from 42,427 to 40,712. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 8.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 60.1% to 54.9% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **14.5% of Wood County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.6% below the national average), and **14.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (5.6% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are General Freight Trucking, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity










Wood County, WI had a March 2024 unemployment rate of 4.06%, increasing from 3.68% 5 years before.




Veterans

Wood County, WI has 5,209 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 3,783.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 22,174 people 55 or older, while there are 27,603 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in Wood County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 30,429 racially diverse people, while there are 6,242 here.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP








Top Occupation Employment Concentration







Educational Pipeline

In 2022, there were 882 graduates in Wood County, WI. This pipeline has grown by 6% over the last 4 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide" (Certificate), "Emergency Medical Technology/Technician (EMT Paramedic)" (Certificate), and "Registered Nursing/Registered Nurse" (Associate's).
