


Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population increased by 7.8% since 2018, growing by 2,777. Population is expected to increase by 5.1% between 2023 and 2028, adding 1,932.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs increased by 0.1% in Oneida County, WI from 18,553 to 18,575. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.5% by 4.4%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 59.7% to 55.5% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **16.8% of Oneida County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (4.4% below the national average), and **12.8% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.0% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, General Medical and Surgical Hospitals, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.









Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Oneida County, WI had a September 2024 unemployment rate of 2.30%, decreasing from 4.16% 5 years before.



Millennials


Oneida County, WI has 5,417 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 7,767.






Veterans

Oneida County, WI has 2,882 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 1,953.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Oneida County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 11,540 people 55 or older, while there are 18,251 here.




Violent Crime

Oneida County, WI has 1.15 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.6 per 1,000 people.




Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Oneida County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 15,920 racially diverse people, while there are 2,107 here.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP









Educational Pipeline

In 2023, there were 392 graduates in Oneida County, WI. This pipeline has shrunk by 24% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide" (Certificate), "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Associate's), and "Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse Training" (Certificate).
