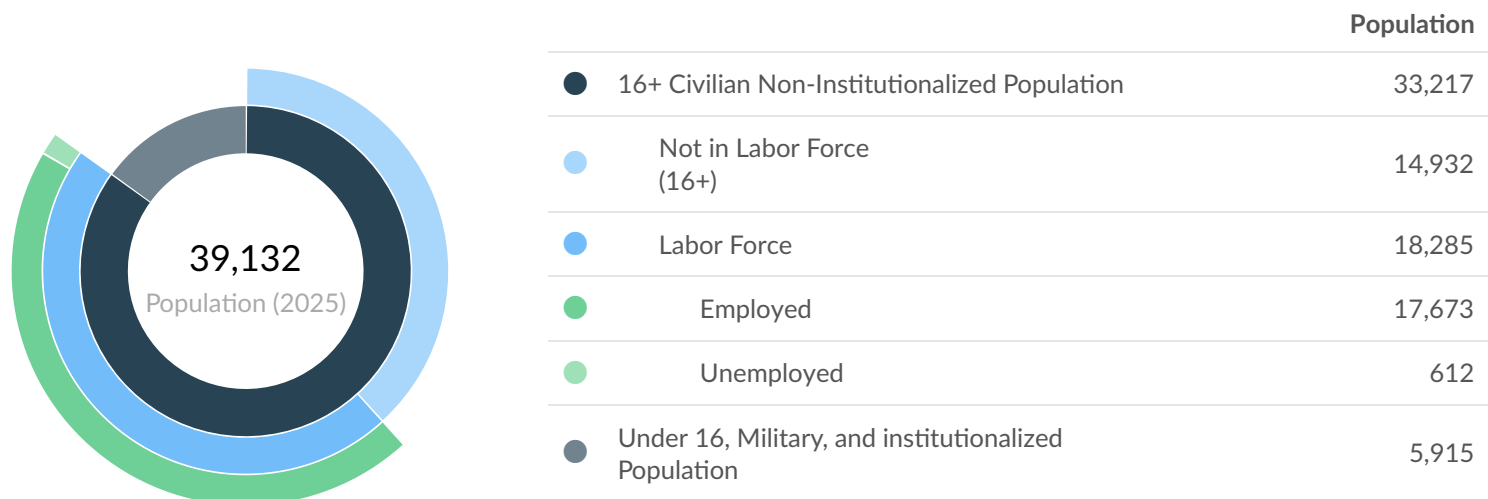
Median household income is **\$8.9K below** the national median household income of \$78.5K.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **increased by 8.8%** since 2019, growing by 3,118. Population is expected to **increase by 4.2%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 1,634.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **increased by 2.6%** in Oneida County, WI from 18,235 to **18,700**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 1.7%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 59.9% to 56.0% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **17.8% of Oneida County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (3.7% below the national average), and **12.8% hold an Associate's Degree** (3.9% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, General Medical and Surgical Hospitals, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

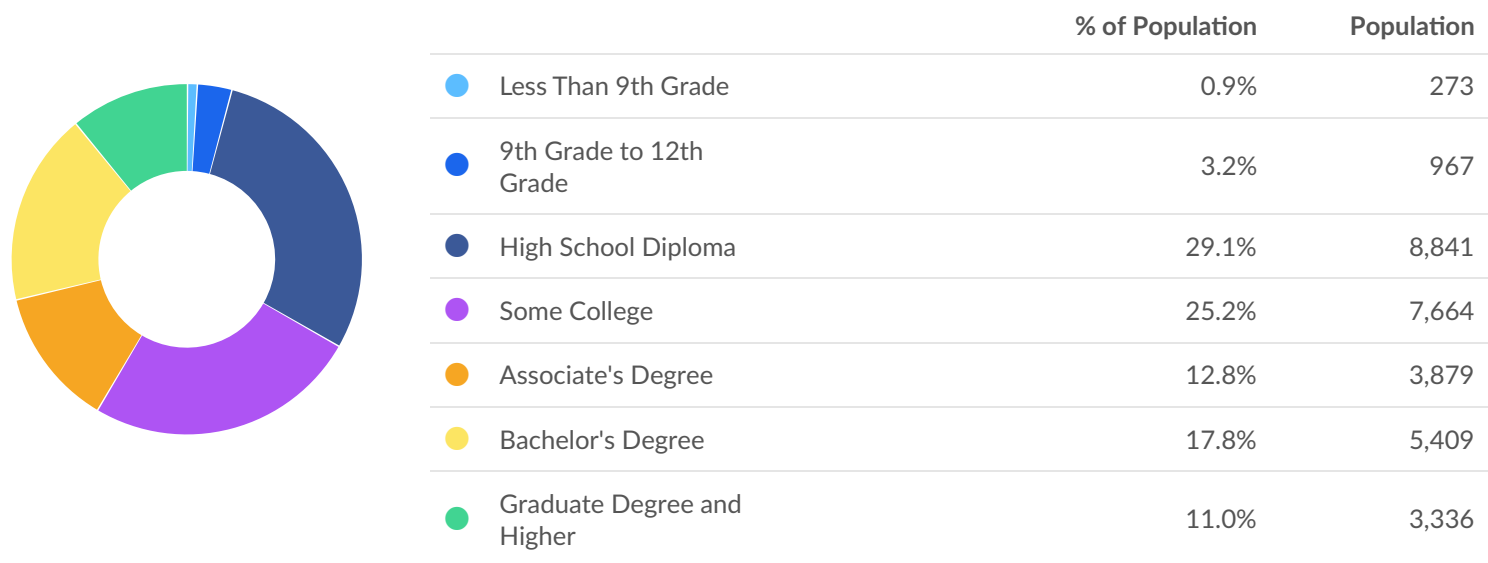

May 2025 Labor Force Breakdown



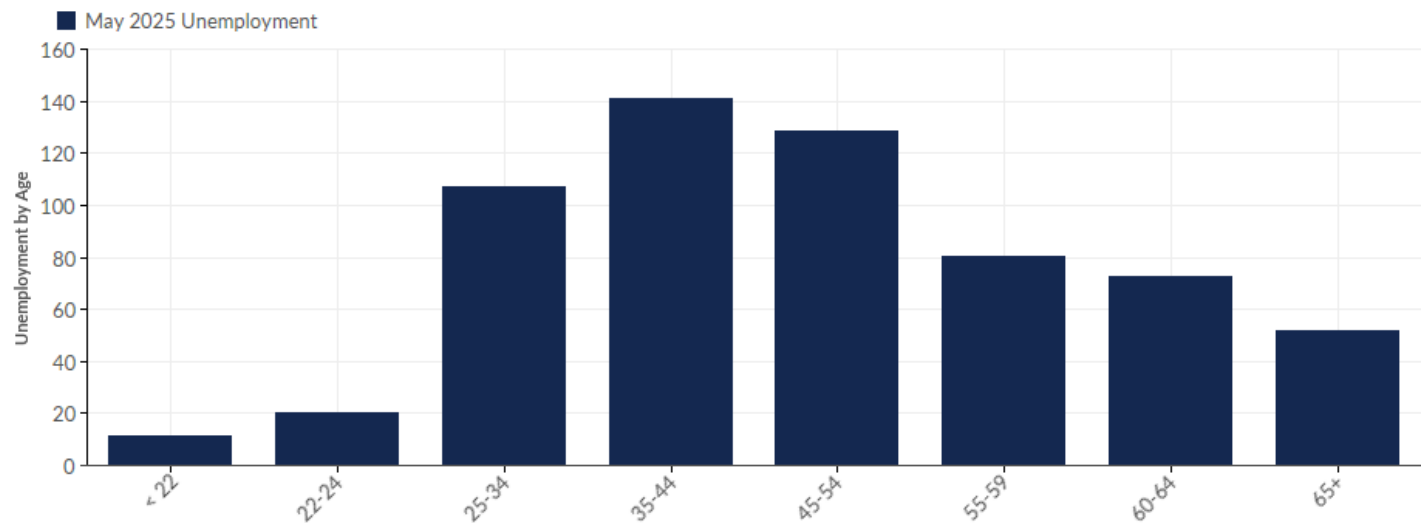
Educational Attainment

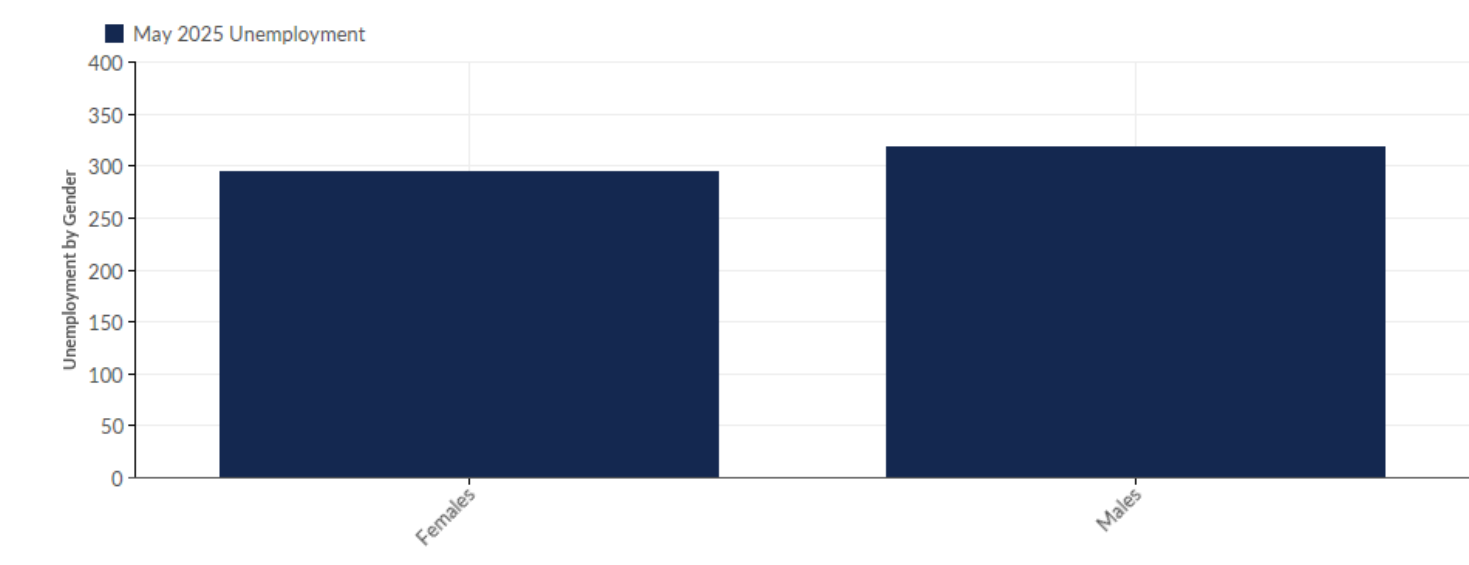

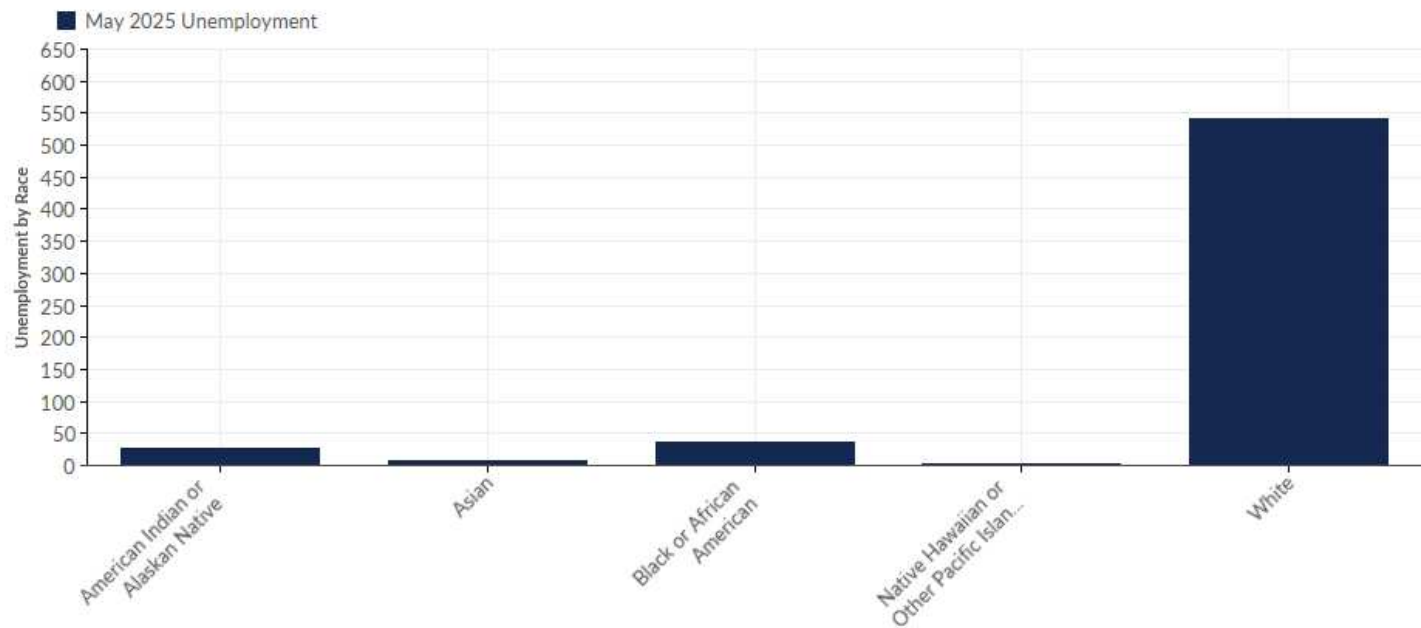

Unemployment by Gender



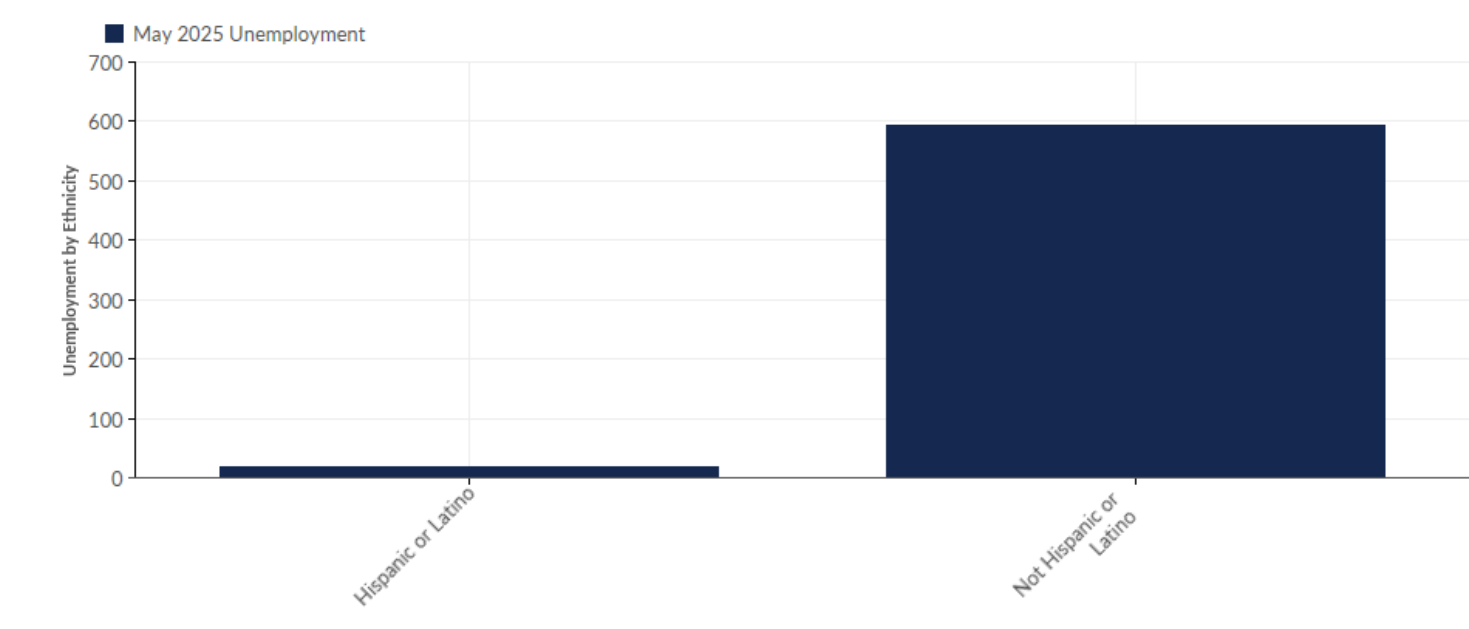

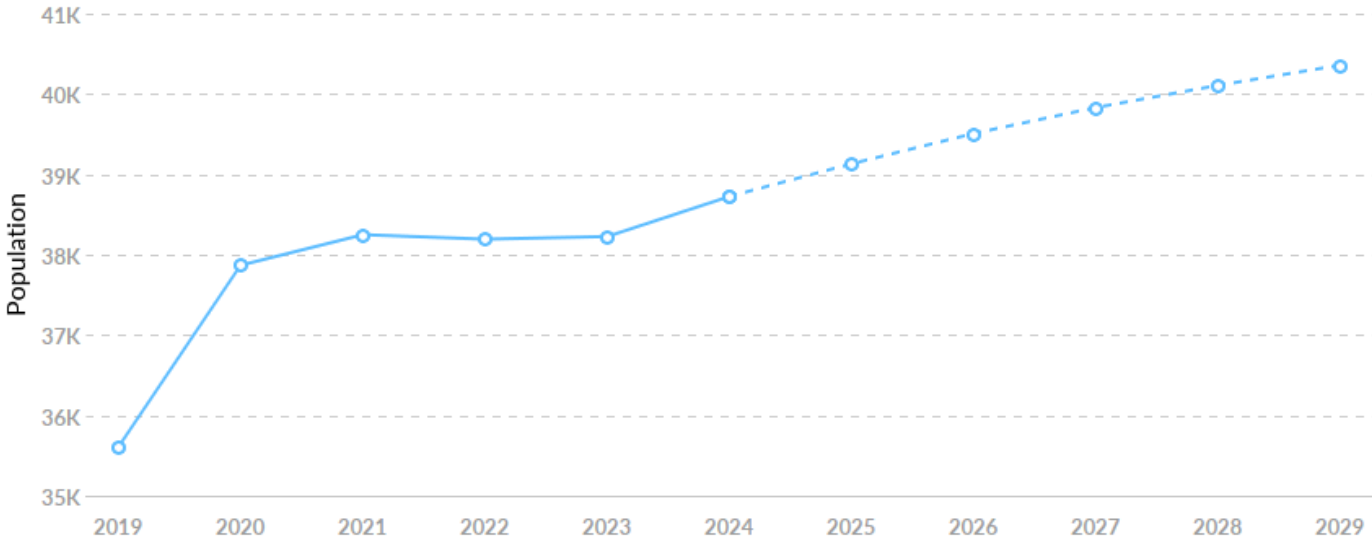

Population Trends

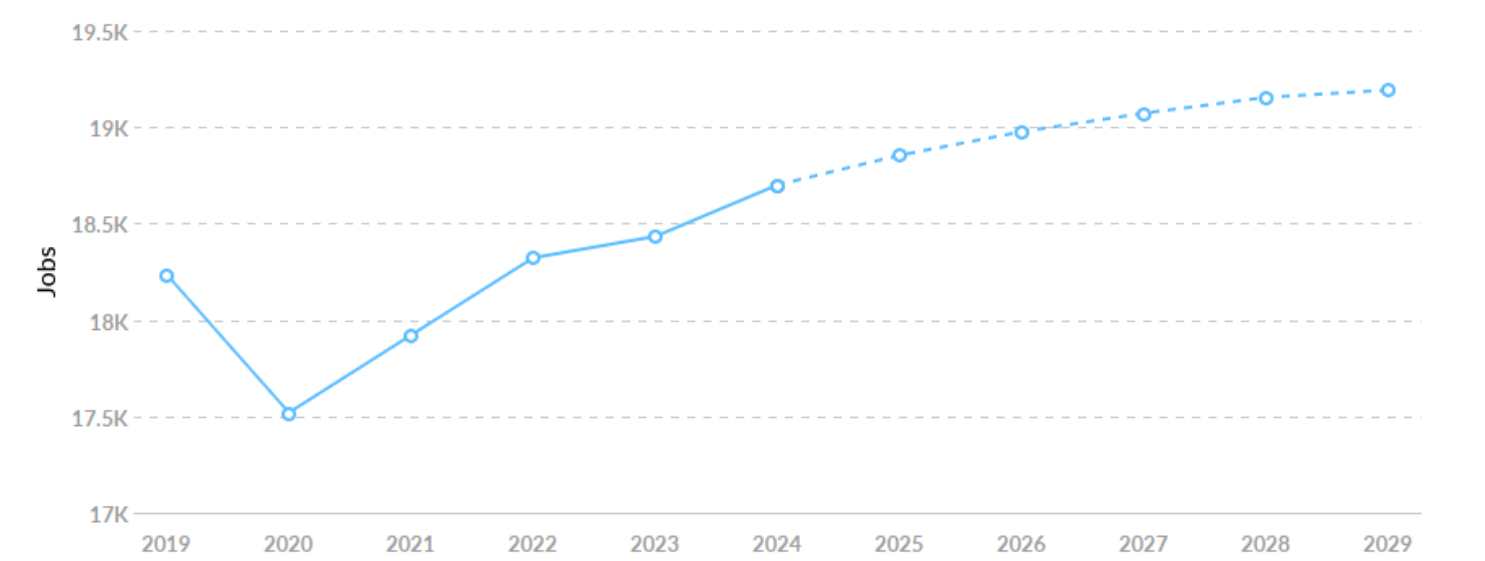

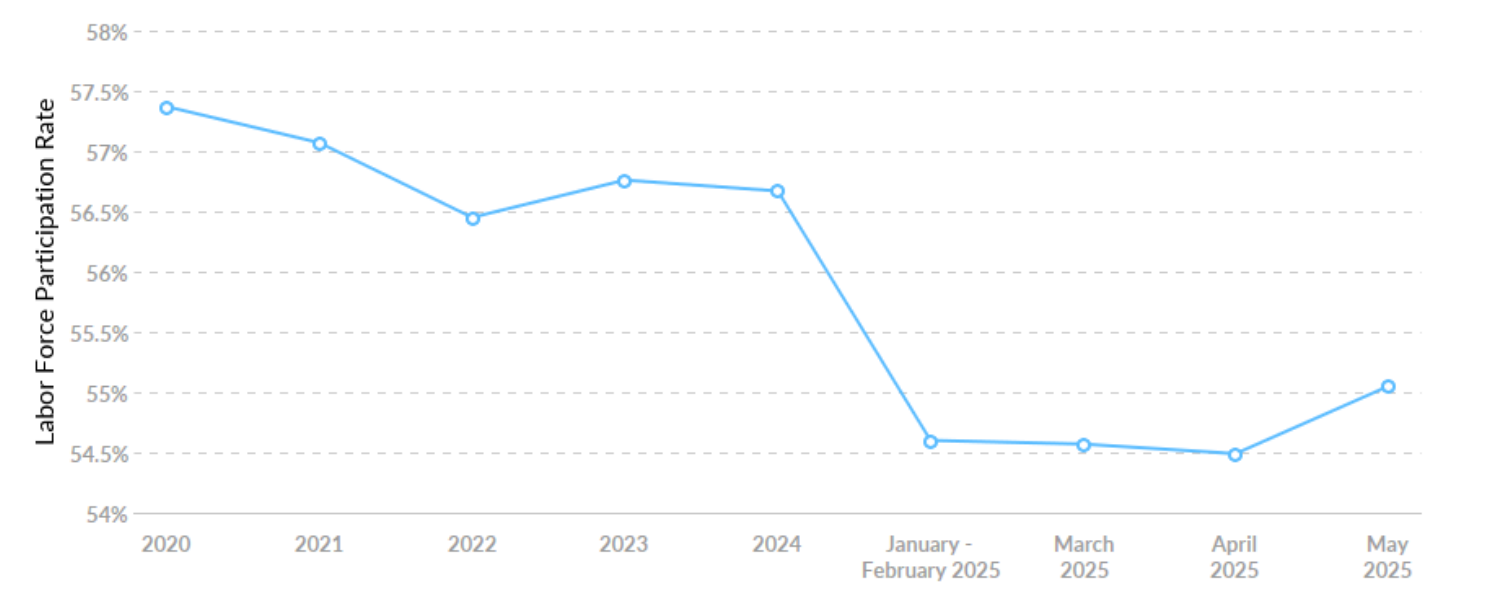
Job Trends

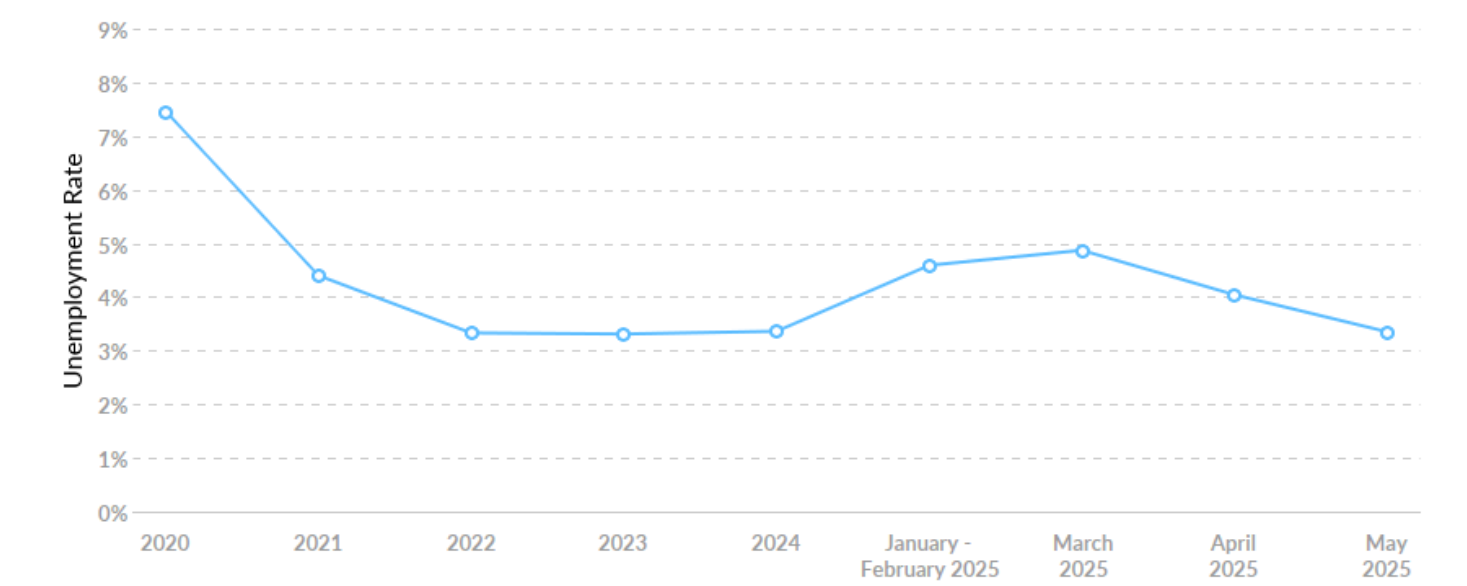

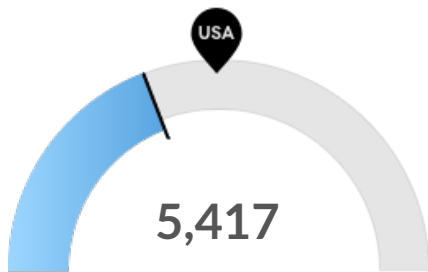
Unemployment Rate Trends

Oneida County, WI had a May 2025 unemployment rate of 3.35%, **decreasing from 7.46%** 5 years before.



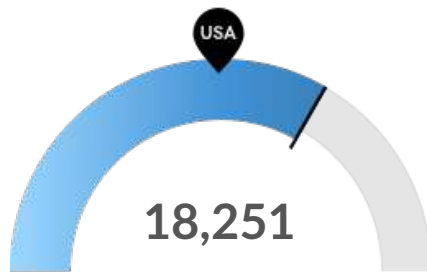

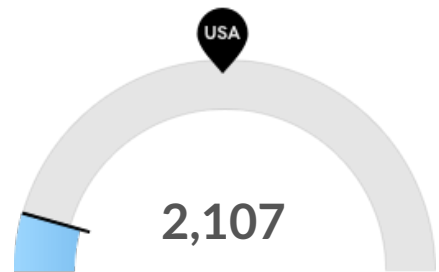
Millennials

Oneida County, WI has 5,417 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 7,767.



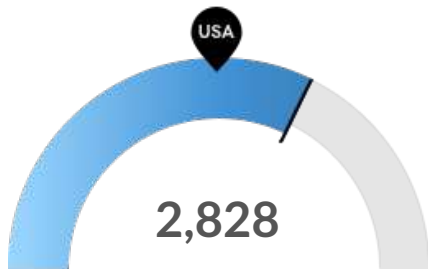
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Oneida County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 11,540 people 55 or older, while there are 18,251 here.



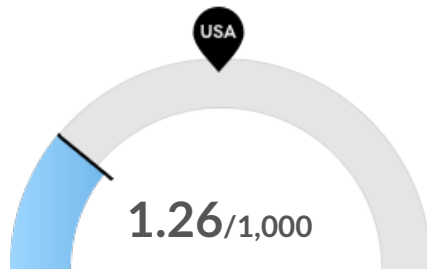
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Oneida County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 15,920 racially diverse people, while there are 2,107 here.



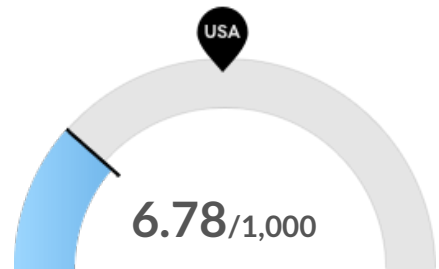
Veterans

Oneida County, WI has 1.26 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.

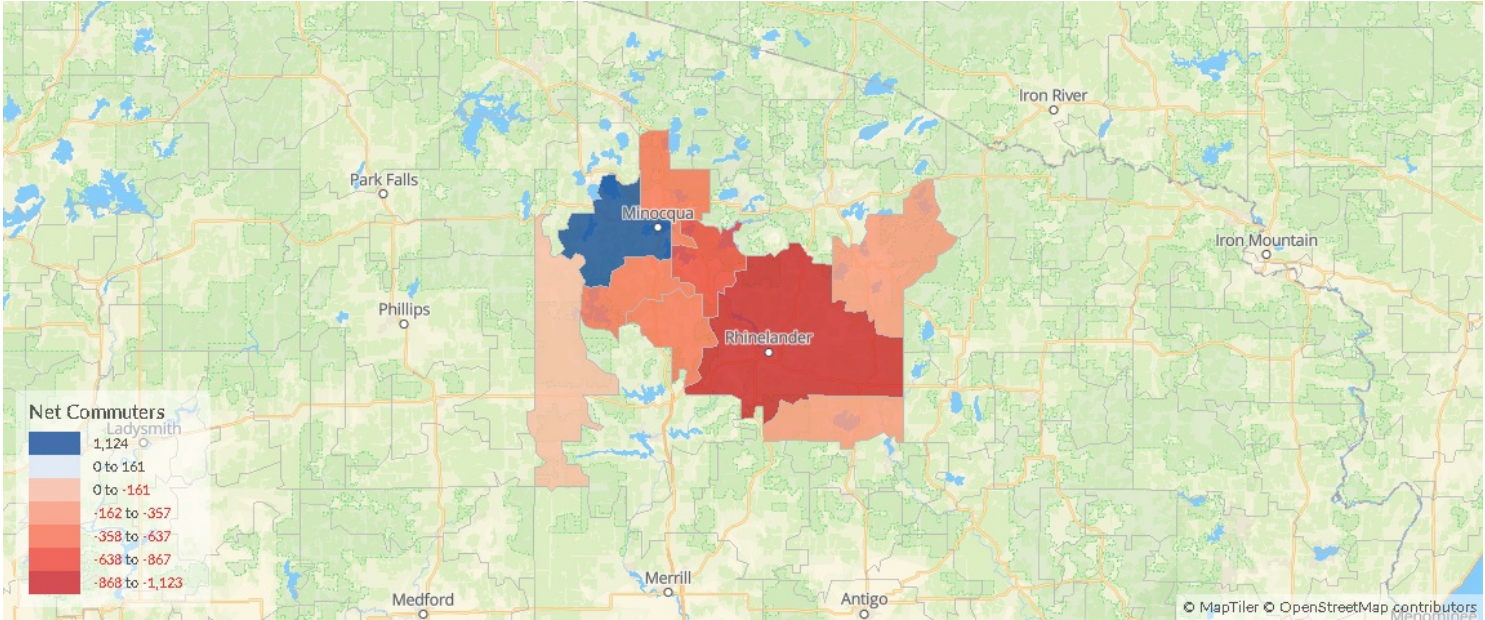


Property Crime

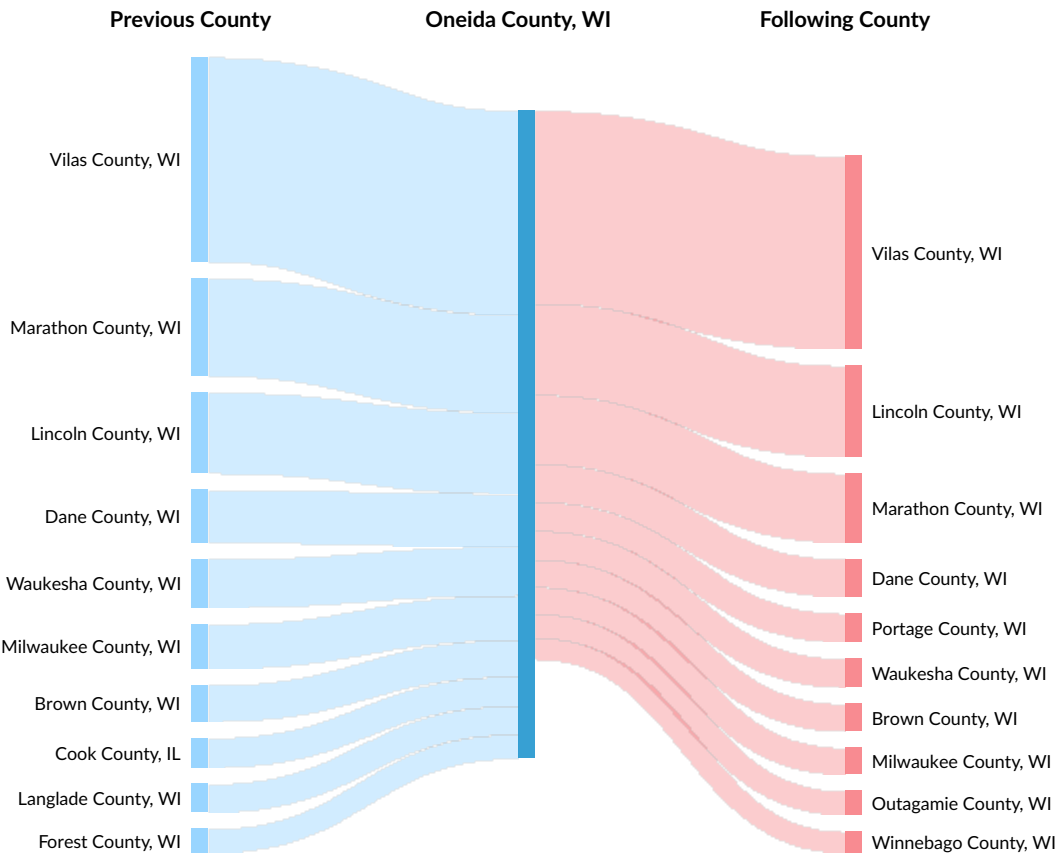

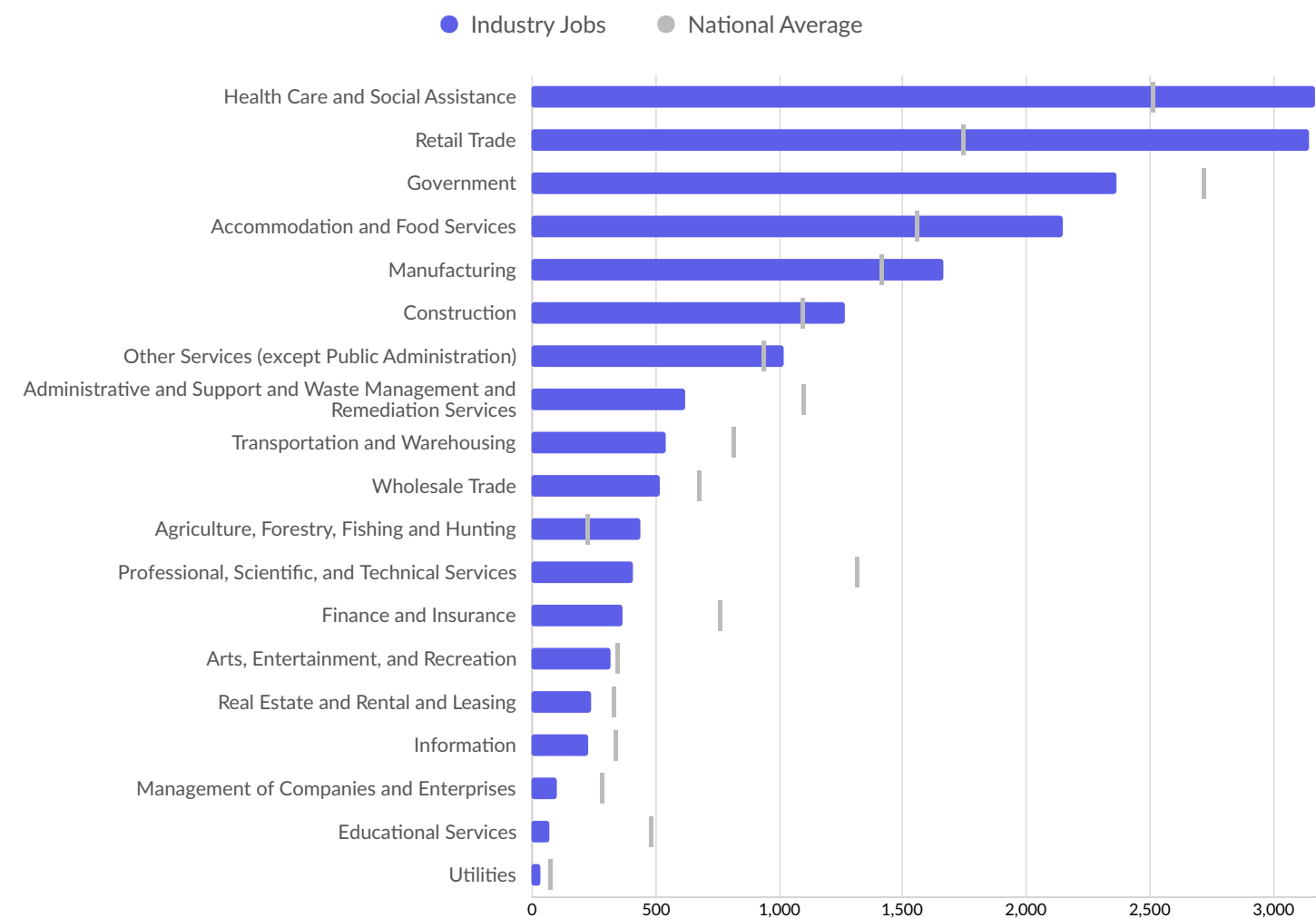

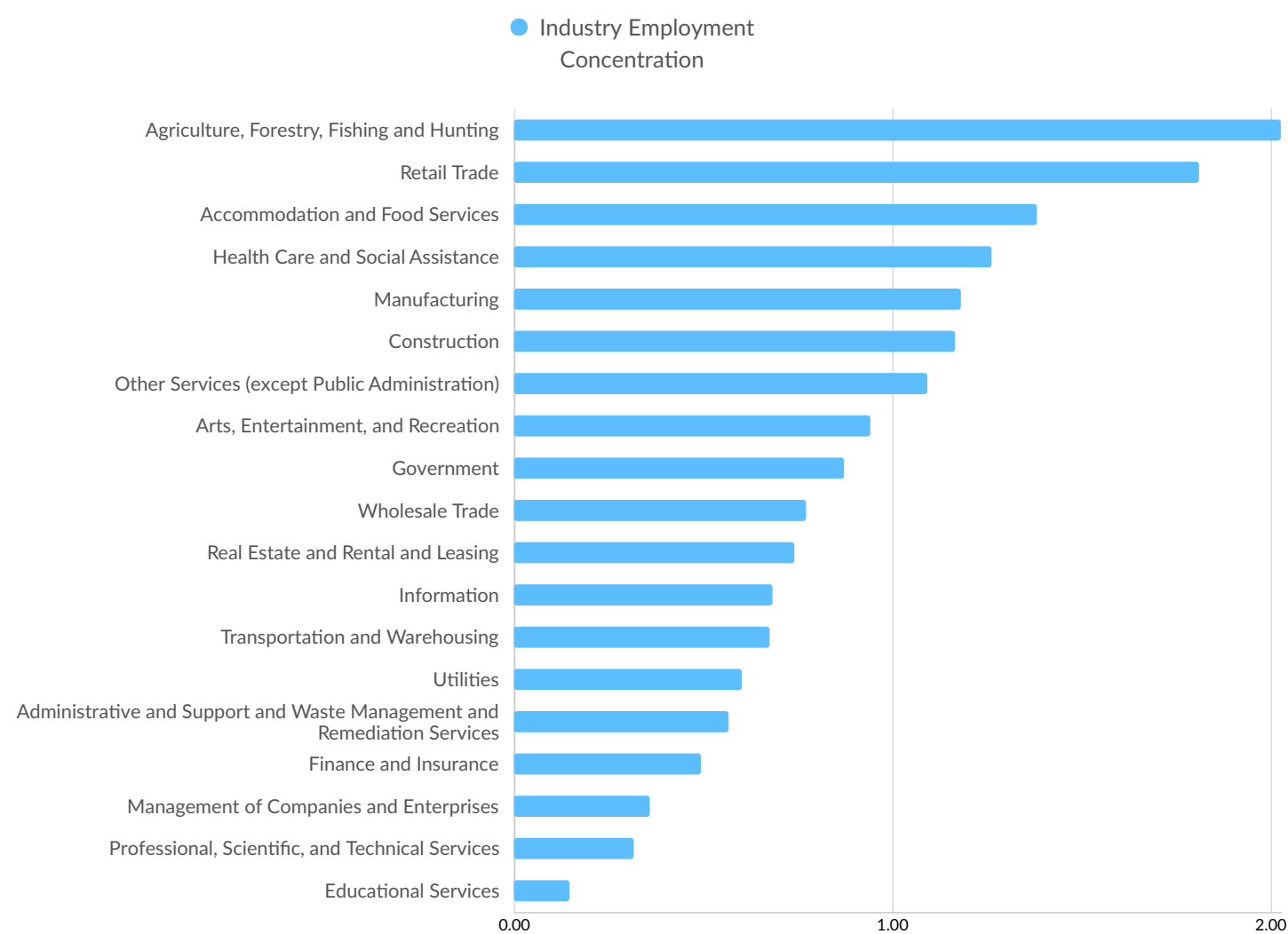

Top Growing Industries

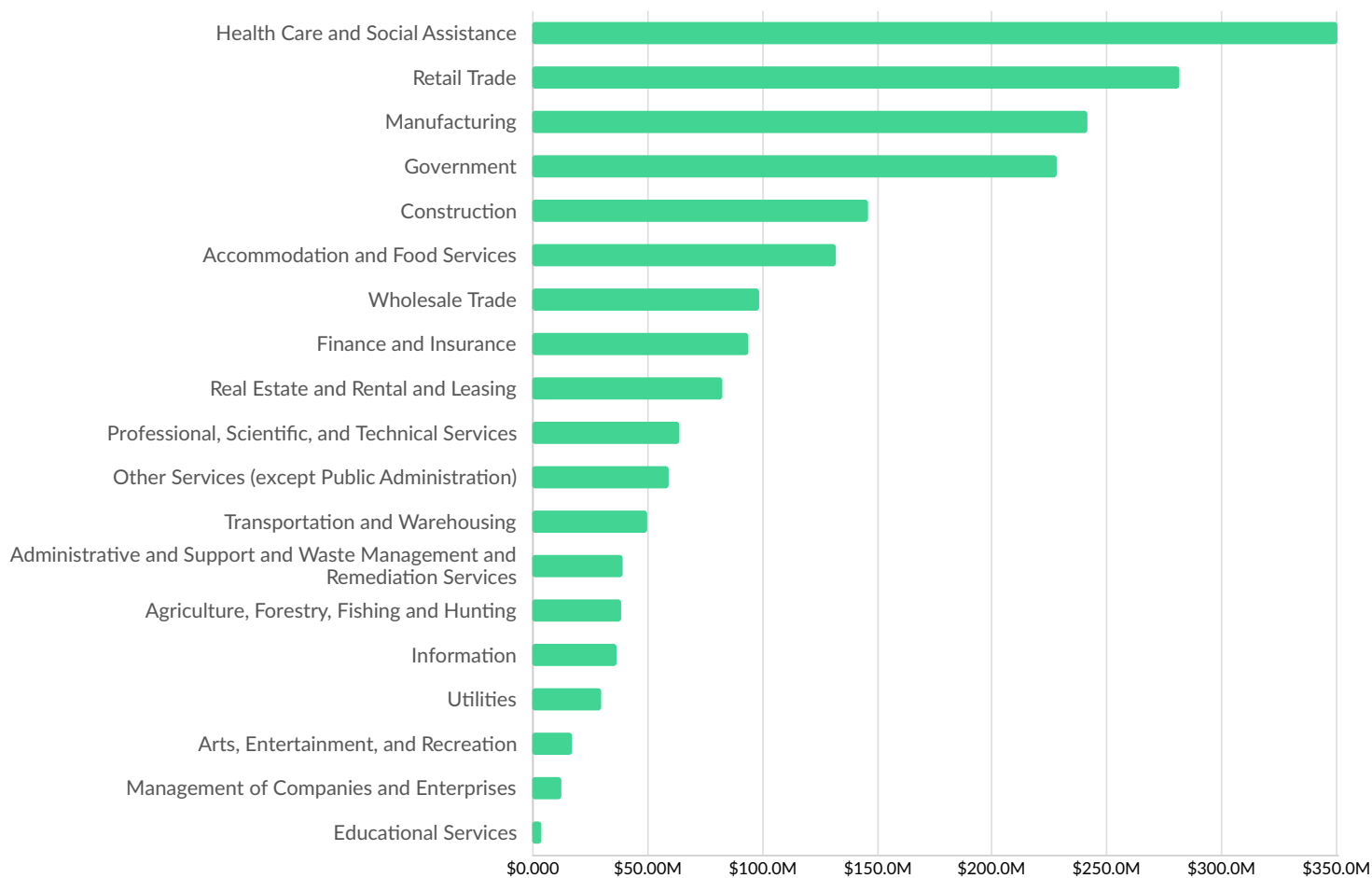


Top Industry Employment Concentration

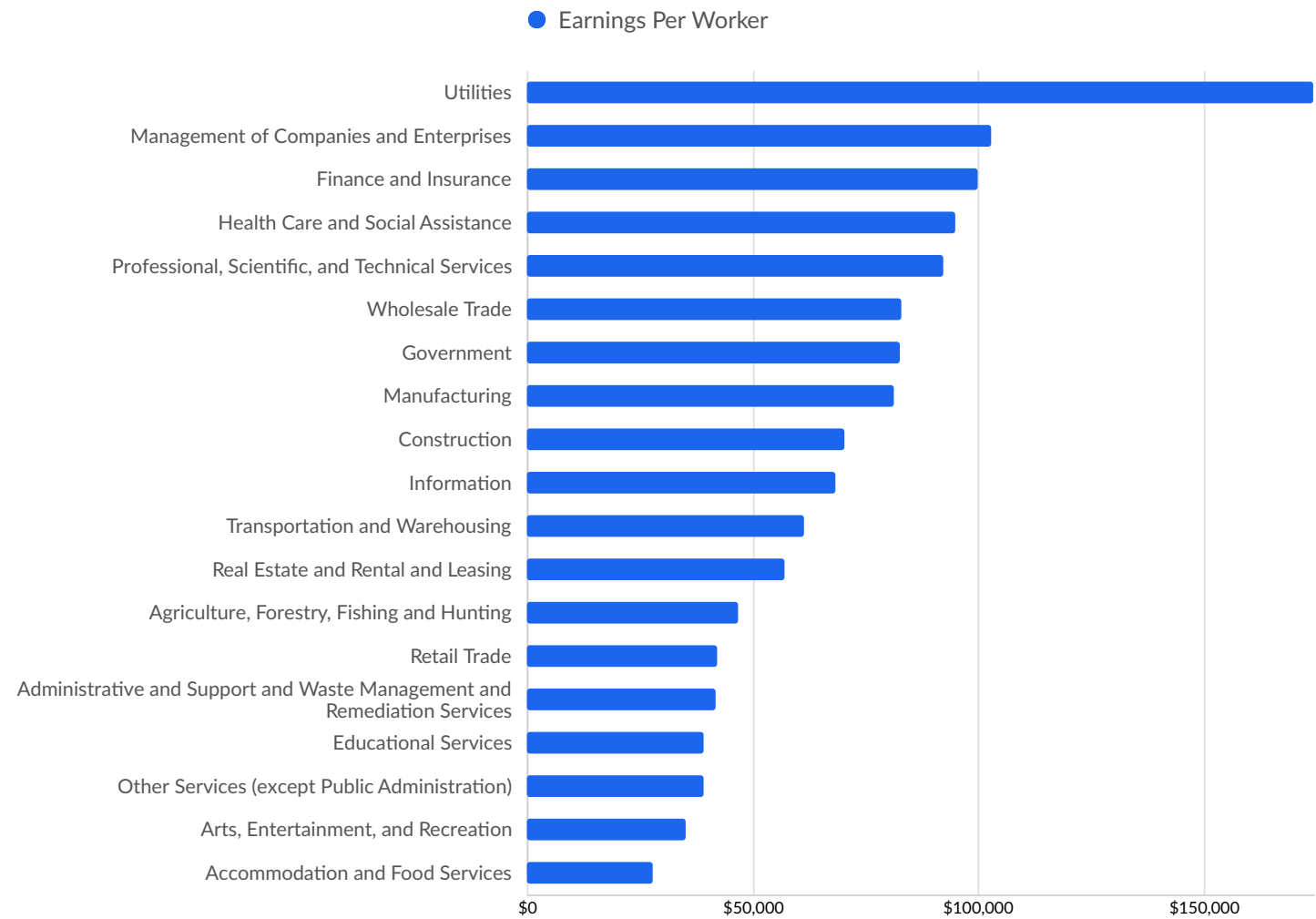


Top Industry GRP

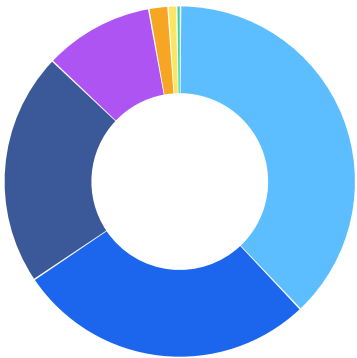

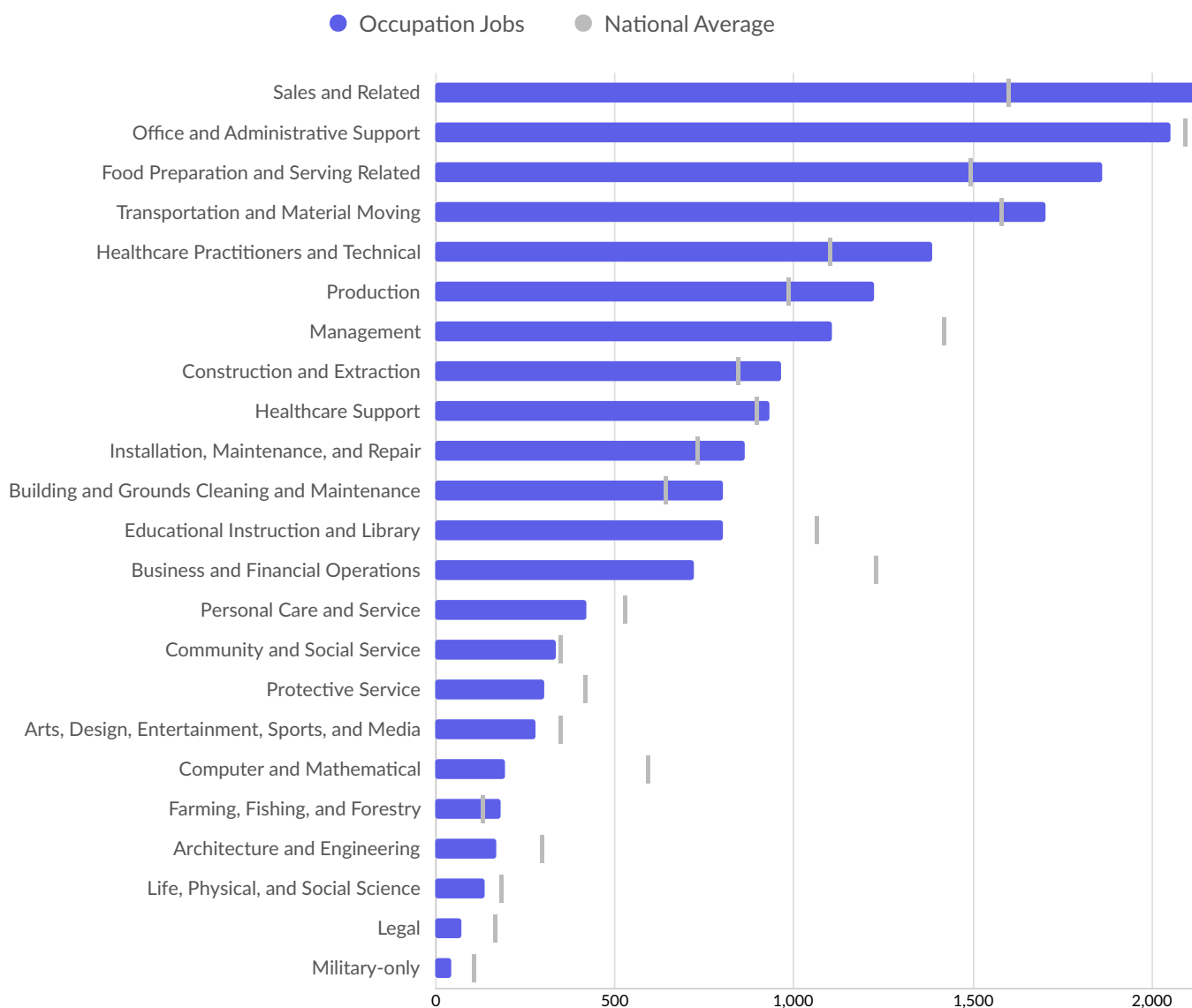

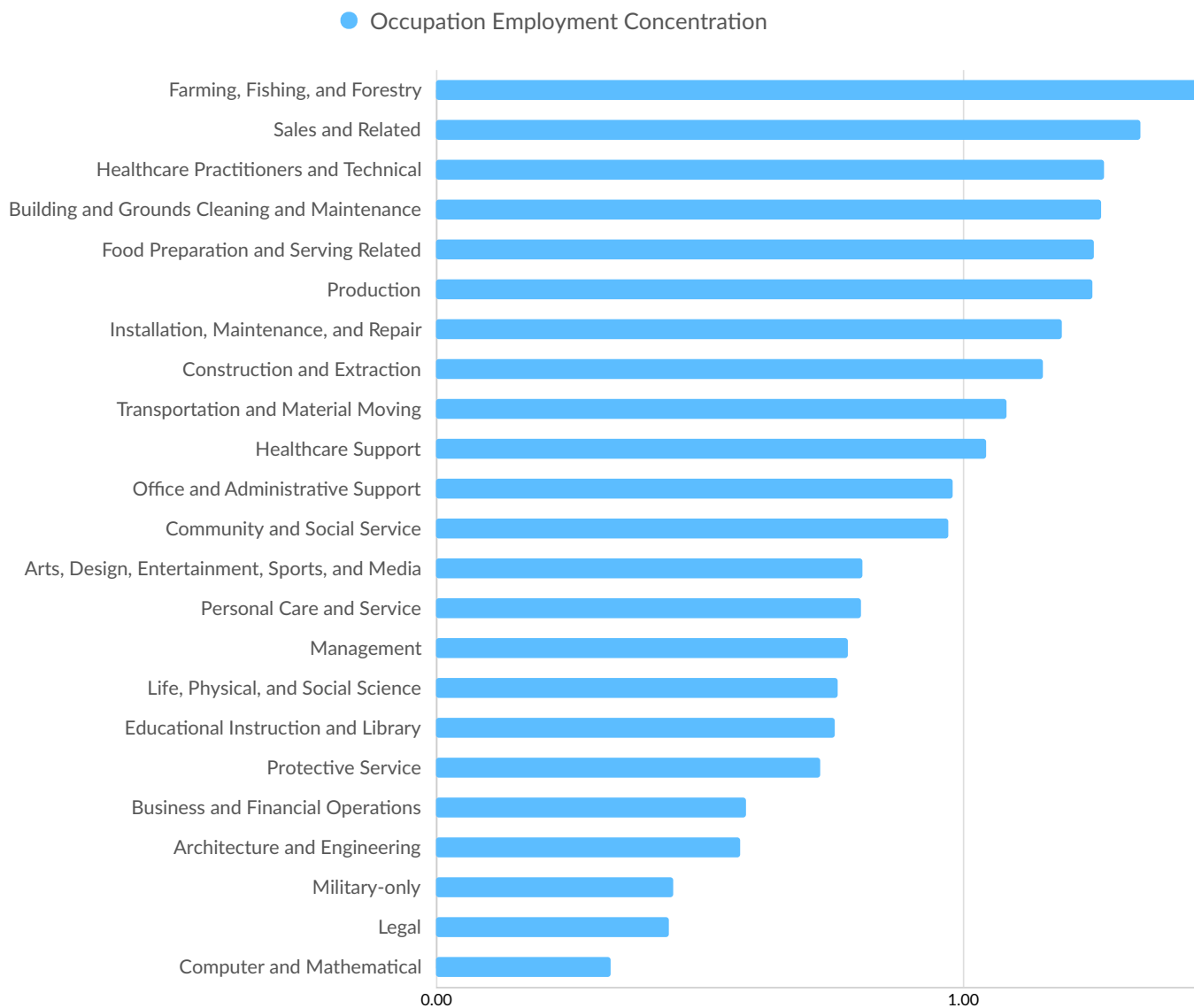

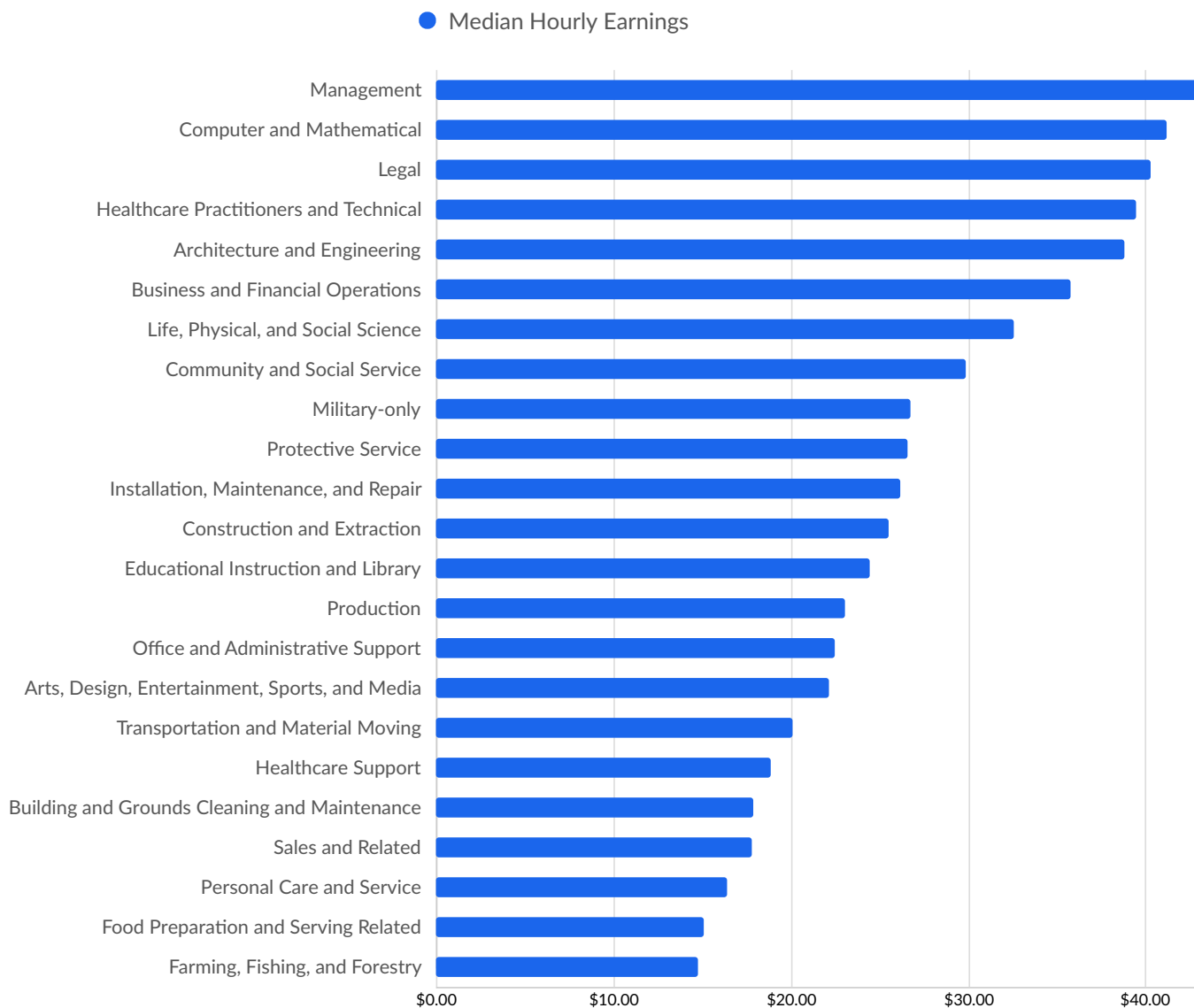
Top Growing Occupations



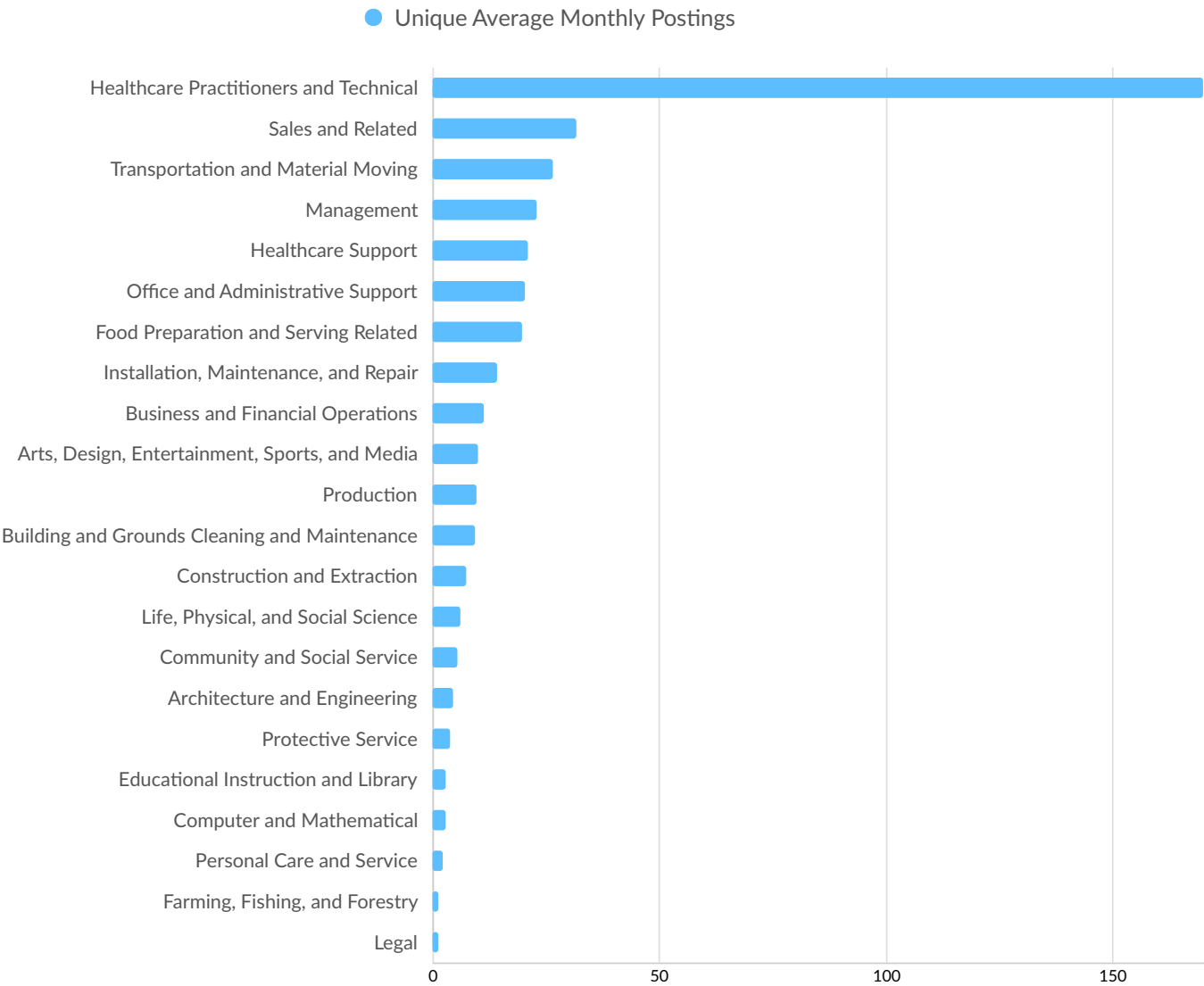
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



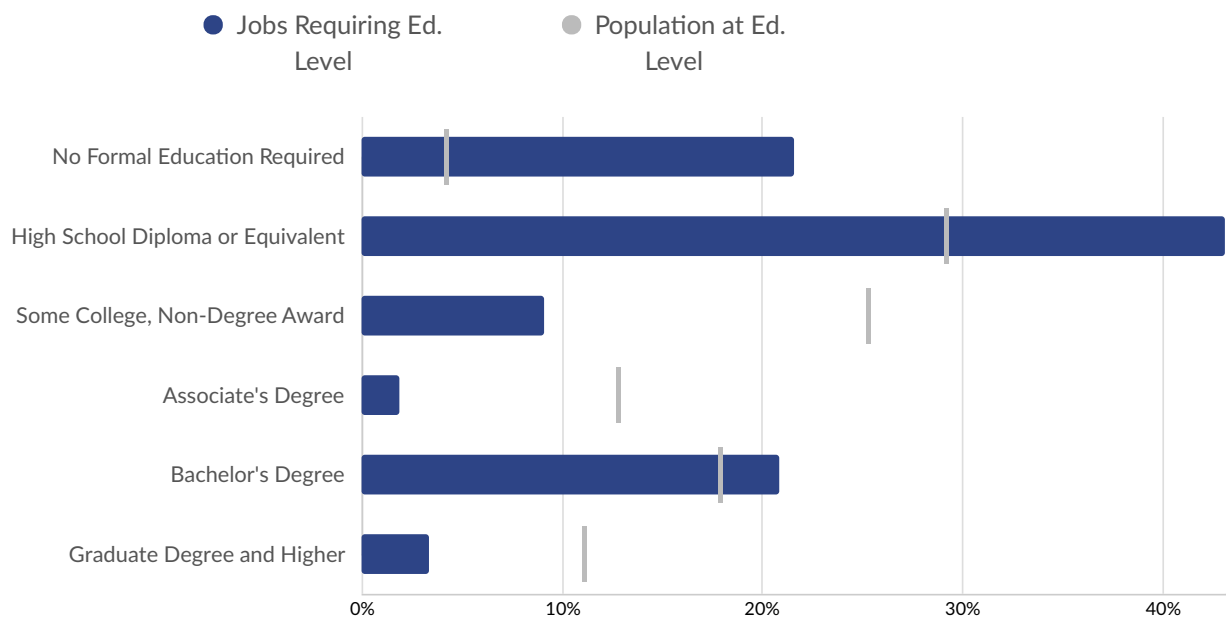
Top Occupation Earnings

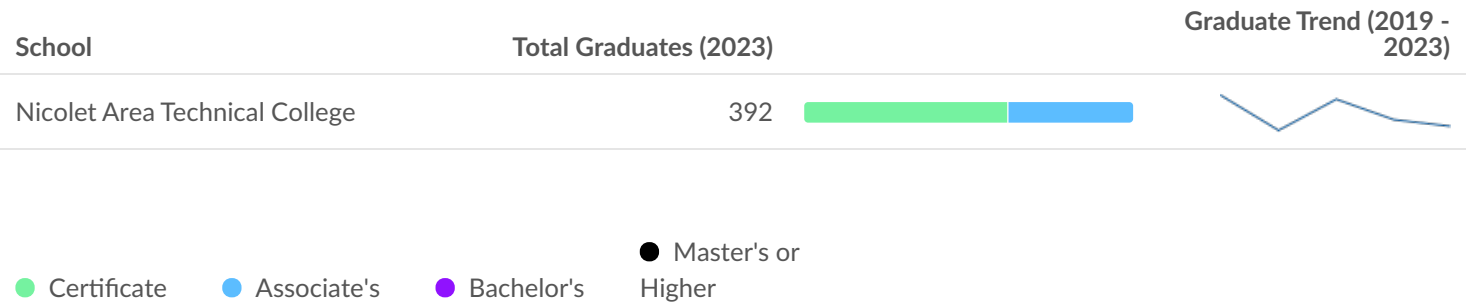

Educational Pipeline

In 2023, there were 392 graduates in Oneida County, WI. This pipeline has shrunk by 24% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Nursing Assistant/Aide and Patient Care Assistant/Aide" (Certificate), "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Associate's), and "Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse Training" (Certificate).
