Regional average earnings per job are \$20.2K below the national average earnings of \$86.7K per job.


Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population increased by 2.9% since 2019, growing by 12,652. Population is expected to increase by 2.0% between 2024 and 2029, adding 9,215.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs declined by 1.8% in NCWRPC from 228,456 to 224,456. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 4.4% by 6.2%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 64.1% to 60.9% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, **17.5% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (4.0% below the national average), and **12.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.1% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity




















Racial Diversity














Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP





Top Occupation Employment Concentration



In 2024, there were 5,630 graduates in NCWRPC. This pipeline has shrunk by 1% over the last 5 years.
