

In 1859, James McBride set wood post with the following BTs: Birch, 8", S.30°W., 8 links; Hemlock, 24", N.8°W., 42 links.


In 1908, J. J. Melendy reestablished corner, setting irregular shaped stone 10" \times 10" \times 24" in a pit of stones.

In 1977, T. Arnott found post point 8" below ground level and set a county monument and made the following BTs: White Birch, 14", N.68°E., 71.60 feet; White Birch, 14", S.19°W., 15.60 feet; White Birch, 6", N.56°W., 22.30 feet.

In 1987, Alan Harrison found that the corner position fell in the north wheel track of a woods road and the monument was gone. He replaced the monument from T. Arnott's bearing trees.


