

In 1859, James McBride set wood post and made the following BTs: Birch, 10", N.15°E., 19 links; Fir, 10", S.33°W., 11 links.

In 1905, N. Smith found original corner and Birch BT standing (green).


In the 1930s, R. Reinike found Spruce post in good condition and scribed Hemlock BT, S.32°E., 23 links. Placed location poster on Aspen, 5", S.72°E., 9 links.

In 1982, Milo Stefan found mound of rock with post hole—from which a broken-off Aspen with location tag at base was found, S.72°E., 5.9 feet and remains of original Birch stump, N.15°E., 12.5 feet. Set monument and new references.




