

In 1859, James McBride established this corner and set a wood post and BTs:

12" W. Pine, N21°E, 41 Links 8" W. Pine, S5°W, 15 Links


In 1965, Forest Service surveyor, Jean Resvick, restored this corner by placement of a 2" x 60" galv. iron pipe/B.C. and made four new BTs. The restoration certificate was never completed on this corner that we can now locate:

3/21/89 I found the iron pipe/B.C. removed and lying next to the NW BT.

6/27/89 I restored the corner by replacing it in the proper location from the original White Pine bearing trees and the Resvick bearing tree.

  - 5) 5" Black Spruce, (Dead), N67°W, 5.62'
  - 6) 6" Black Spruce, N24°W, 20.30'
  - 7) 16"-18" White Pine stump with "BT" blaze plain, N21°E, 27.1'
  - 8) 18"-20" White Pine stump with "BT" blaze plain, S5°W, 9.9'
  - 9) Steel Sign Post, NW, 1.70
