


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

Original Survey in 1859 by James McBride. Set wood post and the following bearing trees; Birch, 10", N.67°E., 24 links, Birch, 8", N.48°W., 37 links.

In 1965, Jean Resvick (RLS) restored the corner position at the intersection of the center-line of a North-South road, and fence lines East and West. Set a 1" square head bolt at the corner position. Set a 2" X 60" galvanized iron pipe West 33.00 feet from corner position for witness corner.

In 1995, Alan Harrison (RLS) found corner position in blacktop of County Hwy "H". Found witness corner monument S.82°W., 31.78 feet. Set a steel sign post 1.00 feet West of W.C. Monument. Blazed and scribed 2 new bearing trees as listed below.
