



U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD


INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through !).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system.

O - Corner monument restored.

Quarter Corner to Sections 9 and 10, T.35N., R.15E., Forest County, Wisconsin.



(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859, James McBride set a wood post with the following BTs: Birch, 10", N.50°W., 19 links; Hemlock, 8", S.31°E., 29 links.

In 1904, N.H. Smith found original corner.

In 1906, N.H. Smith found corner obliterated and re-established the corner with the following BTs: Hemlock, 12", N.12½°W., 42 links; Sugar, 12", N.57 3/4°E., 63 1/3 links.

In 1991, Alan Harrison (RLS) found 1" Re-Bar in a post hole with no bt. evidence. Position of Re-Bar fit well with the Smith survey and is accepted as a pertetuation of the corner by Smith.

- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference ties which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. Indicate north.
