


In 1859, James McBride set a wood post with the following BTs: Sugar, 8", N.28°W., 34 links; Birch, 16", S.43°W., 13 links.

In 1908, J. J. Melendy found both original BTs standing with marks plain. He set a new Cedar post $5" \times 5" \times 48"$.

In 1987, Alan Harrison searched area and found no evidence. He then restored corner position retracement of J. Melendy's survey from the southeast section corner of Section 14 through the east one-sixteenth corner on the south line of Section 14.
