


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set a wood post with the following B.T.'s: Sugar, 12", S.76°E., 17 links (11.22 feet); Sugar, 14", N.77°W., 8 links (5.28 feet).

In 1928, Goodman Company found 31" Elm post set by Wells Company and following B.T.'s: Maple, 16", S.75°E., 17 links (11.22 feet). Set a 3" Ironwood post and $2" \times 36"$ flue pipe.

In 1990, Alan Harrison (RLS) found 2" flue pipe and post hole. Stump hole, S.75°E., 11.22 feet from flue pipe. Accepted Goodman Company's perpetuation of original corner.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, If the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron orother equally durable material.)
