

1857 - Artemas Curtis established this corner and set a wood post and made two bearing Sugar, 6", N67°W, 25 Links and a Sugar, 12", S62°E, 39 Links

1934 - 1935 - J.J. Jenkins attempted to restore this corner by Lost Methods. He placed a 4" x 36" iron pipe with brass cap for the corner.

August 7, 1990 - Milo E. Stefan, in the section subdivision of Section 24 to the West, found this corner to be in error by 10.6 feet. In consultation with Nicolet National Forest Surveyor, Al Harrison, and Marinette County Surveyor, Jerome Pillath, decided to use the county monument as a Witness Corner and restore this corner at its proper location by single proportionate measure between the Section Corners North and South.


