




December 22, 1992, John Garske found 2 1/2" O.D. iron pipe with 2 1/2" brass cap stamped: Forest Co. Forest Crop Survey, section comer, S13, S18, S19, S24, T36N, R13E, 9-1-38, C.E. Walker. Monument protrudes 3'± above ground. No record of Walker's notes can be found.

I accepted the Walker monument after finding several others of similar type in the area which have been accepted and recorded by local surveyors. Mr. Walker's work in the 30's appears to have been of good quality as testified by other surveyors I have talked with.
