


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859 James Mc Bride set a wood post and marked B.T.s as follow; Spruce 10" S.29 W. 20 1ks., W.Pine 16" N.61 E. 15 1ks.


In 1986 I recovered corner position from remains of original B.T.s; found evidence of B.T.s as follow; Rotted Pine Stump 2' N.60 E. 9.9', Stp. Hole 1 1/2' S.30 W. 13'; at position indicated by remains of B.T.s, found soil discoloration in clay bearing soil indicating the core of an ancient stake hole; I accept this location as correct and set a 2"x 36" aluminum pipe with cap; referenced as shown below.
