




U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O - Corner monument restored.

> Corner common to Sections 13, 18, 19, and 24, T.36N., R.15-16E., Forest County, Wisconsin.




(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1857 Artemus Curtis set post and made the following references: Aspen, 16", S.65°W., 47 links (31.02'); Aspen, 10", N.70°W., 15 links (9.90'); Aspen, 10". N.03°E., 25 links (16.50'); Aspen, 14", S.14°E., 4 links (2.64').

In 1917 John Melendy set elm post, original aspens southeast and southwest decayed stumps. Marked new B.T.'s: Basswood, 14", N.17-1/2°E., 48-3/4 links (32.17'); Birch, 12", S.54-1/4°W., 42 links (27.72"); Birch, 10", S.19-1/2°E., 49-1/2; links (32.67'); Birch, 9", N.32-1/2°W., 50-5/8 links (33.41'). Set North Sixteenth 19.93 chains (1315.38') South.

In 1989 Alan Harrison could find no evidence of original or subsequent survey. Restored corner from retracement of Melendy's survey of section lines.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, , if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron prother equally durable material.)
- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference tles which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. Indicate north.
 - 2½" x 36" aluminum monument with tablet stamped to identify the corner.
 - Sugar, 6", N.78°E., 30.19 feet.
 - 3. Sugar, 7", S.10°E., 32.09 feet.
 - Sugar, 7", S.49°W., 26.72 feet.
 - 5. Sugar, 9", N.39°W., 62.88 feet.
 - Steel Sign Post, Northeast, 1.18 feet.
