Description of original monument and accessories and subsequent restorations:
Surveyed in 1859 by James McBride.  North between Sections 26 and 27, 80.00 chains set post corner to sections 22, 23, 26 and 27.  Sugar, 12 inches, N69W, 18 links  Birch, 15 inches, N16E, 33 links  Sugar, 10 inches, S60E, 36 links  Sugar, 12 inches, S48W, 41 links.
Description of corner evidence found:
$1\frac{1}{4}$ inch iron pipe, 2 feet above ground. S60E, 36 links, maple stump, 29 inch diameter, overgrowth shows scribe marks. No evidence of other bearing trees.
Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the location of this corner:  I replaced the pipe with a 2 inch inside diameter galvanized iron pipe, 3 feet long, filled with concrete, with a brass cap stamped: T36N, R15E, S22, S23, S26, S27, 1980, S-1107  Blazed and scribed the following new bearing trees: Red Pine, 8 inches, N28E, 23.90 feet White Spruce, 14 inches, S28W, 51.75 feet Maple, 9 inches, N40W, 31.26 feet. 



Original survey in 1859 by James McBride. Set wood post and the following bearing trees; Sugar, 12", N.69°W., 18 links, Birch, 15", N.16°E., 33 links, Sugar, 10", S.60°E., 36 links, Sugar, 12", S.48°W., 41 links.

In 1980, William Cochrane, R.L.S., found a 1 1/4" diameter iron pipe. Also found a 29" diameter maple stump, S.60°E., 36 links, with overgrowth that shows scribe marks. In place of iron pipe, set a 2" x 36" galvanized iron pipe with a brass cap stamped to identify corner. Blazed and scribed new bearing trees; Red Pine, 8", N.28°E., 23.90 feet, White Spruce, 14", S.28°W., 51.75 feet, Maple, 9", N.40°W., 31.26 feet.

On December 13, 1991, Alan Harrison R.L.S., found the monument and bearing trees as set by Cochrane in 1980. Blzed and scribed 1 new bearing tree; Elm, 8", S.38°E., 17.21 feet. Set steel sign post, 0.50 feet Northwest of monument.


