



Set corner post and the following bearing trees; Sugar, 16", N.12°W., 57 links, Hemlock, 20", N.68°E., 89 links, Sugar, 10", S.26°E., 66 links, Sugar, 14", S.81°W., 31 links.

In 1980, William Cochrane, RLS, found a 2" diameter iron pipe and original bearing tree evidence. In place of pipe set a 2" x 36" galvanized iron pipe, with a brass cap stamped to identify corner. Made new bearing trees; Maple, 6", N.23°E., 11.54 feet, Maple, 8", S.08°E., 6.89 feet, Yellow Birch, 10", S.58°W., 13.28 feet, Basswood, 14", N.22°W., 30.38 feet.

On 11-16-93, Alan Harrison, RLS, found the monument and bearing trees as described above. Cut down all bearing trees for G.P.S. observations. Made the following new bearing trees; Maple, 11", N.25°E., 38.59 feet, Maple, 11", S.55°E., 52.48 feet, Maple, 6", S.42°W., 28.95 feet, Maple, 6", N.50°W., 49.12 feet, Steel Sign Post, 0.50 feet.
