



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- (b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.
 - 1858 Original post set by James McBride, witnessed by Fir 8 NO5W 21 lks.; Fir 8 S41W 18 1ks.

Found no record of subsequent recovery or remonumentation.

- 1991 Coleman Engineering Company established survey traverse between SW and SE corners of Section 3 to establish search location. No recovery of identi-June fiable original evidence resulted from thorough search of area. Corner was assumed to be lost and to be restored by proportionate method. Established monument at midpoint of straight line between section corners. Position falls 15 to 20 feet West of toe of high ground to East (GLO measure is 0.5 chain or 33 feet). Found leaning 15" Cedar S47°W 58.0' from established monument with Consolidated Waterpower and Paper Co. corner poster dated 1953.
- In the plan view drawing below, provide reference tles to at least 4 witness monuments, or, If the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron prother equally durable material.)
- Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference tles which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the cornér monument la disturbed. Indicate north.
- 1. 2½" x 36" Aluminum monument with location stamped on cap.
- 2. Y. Birch 20" N38°E 6.58' feet.
- 3. Cedar 10" S31°E 53.56 feet.
- 4. Y. Birch 12" S57°W 22.22 feet.
- 5. Y. Birch 14" N34°W 48.61 feet.
- 6. Steel sign post North 1.60 feet.





(a) Describe any material discrepancy between the location of the corner as restored or reestablished prestablished and the location of that corner as previously restored or reestablished by distance and direction. Show the discrepancy on the plan view drawing under (d). above. Show the distances between the corner as previously restored or reestablished and (1) the corner as restored or reestablished, and (2) to at least 2 of the witness monuments shown on the drawing in (d), above.

Found no evidence of prior corner recovery or restoration.

(f) Was the corner restored through acceptance of (1) an obliterated evidence location, or, (2) of found perpetuated location ?
