


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set a wood post for the corner and the following corner references: Aspen 10" N55°E 10 1ks. Aspen 8" S21°E 17 1ks.

In 1988, John Schulke found no evidence. Placed 2 1/2" dia. X 36" aluminum monument. The center of a two track road is South 89 feet from the monument.
