

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational avidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.


In 1858, James McBride set a wood post for the corner and the following corner references: Aspen 12" N72°E 5 1ks. Aspen 12" S54°W 19 1ks.

In 1926, Goodman Lumber Company set a wood post by proportional measurement and replaced it with a Flue pipe extending 15" high above the ground. Found a 20" Maple bearing tree 297 links North and .88 links East of post. Field notes call for two Aspen bearing trees.

In 1988, John Schulke found an iron pipe but did not accept it. The 1 1/2" diameter iron pipe is S70°W 11.02 feet from the monument. Placed 2 1/2" X 36" aluminum monument.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (Witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, from or other equally durable material.)

  - 1. 2 1/2" dia. X 36" aluminum magnetic cap monument stamped to identify the corner.
  - 2. Sugar Maple 7" N33°E 18.96 feet
  - 3. Sugar Maple 7" S44°E 12.33 feet
  - 4. Sugar Maple 4" S10°W 8.99 feet
  - 5. Sugar Maple 6" N80°W 14.05 feet
  - 6. Steel sign post Northwest 1.6 feet



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(e) Describe any material discrepancy between the location of the corner as restored or reastablished and the location of that corner as previously restored or reastablished by distance and direction. Show the discrepancy on the plan view drawing under (d), above. Show the distances between the corner as previously restored or reastablished and (1) the corner as restored or reastablished, and (2) to at least 2 of the witness monuments shown on the drawing in (d), above.


