


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1857, Artemas Curtis set a wood post and the following bearing trees; Tamarack, 16", N.58°W., 25 links (16.50 feet), Spruce, 5", S.34°E., 19 links (12.54 feet) East 29.55 chains, stream 10 links wide, runs East-Northeast. East 29.10 chains stream 10 links wide, runs Southeast. West 10.00 chains stream 10 links wide runs Northeast.

On July 27, 1993, Alan D. Harrison (RLS) restored the corner position at proportionate distance and on line between the Southwest and South east Section Corners of Section 32.

No corner evidence was recovered.

- (c) in the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, fron orother equally durable material.)

  - 5. Steel Sign Post, North, 1.22 feet.


