



- (b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.
  - In 1857, Artemas Curtis set a wood post at the corner with the following bearing trees: Hemlock 16" S87°W 49 lks. Yellow Birch 8" East 2 lks.
  - In 1973, Jean Resvick recovered scribed cedar post and recovered the following bearing trees: Birch stump East 8 lks. Hemlock remains S87°W 49 lks. The swamp calls to the North and South fits GLO notes. Replaced wood post with a 2" dia. galvanized iron pipe, filled with concrete with a brass cap stamped to identify the corner. The following corner references:

    Maple 7" S23°E 32.34 ft. Y Birch 6" N86°W 47.35 ft. Steel post SW 1.0 ft.
  - In 1982, Kim Pritzlaff recovered monument in place and the 1973 corner references described on the Certified Land Corner Restoration form filed in the Forest County Register of Deed's Office, Document #104442.
  - In 1990, John Schulke recovered monument in place and the following corner references:

Triple Red Maple 8" S21°E 32.24 ft. Y. Birch 8" N87°W 47.37 ft.

Y. Birch 8" N87°W 47.37 ft. Steel sign post SW 1.0 ft.

The following new corner reference:

Sugar Maple 6" S25°W 31.97 ft.



Original Government Survey in 1857 by Artemas Curtis.

In 1973, Jean Resvick, a Land Surveyor with the U.S. Forest Service, found a 6"x6" scribed cedar post badly rotted and in concurrence with original bearing tree evidence. In place of post, set a 2" diameter galvanized iron pipe, 3 feet long, with a brass cap stamped: T37N, R15E, R16E, 1/4, S1, S6, 1973, S-802, from which the following bear:




